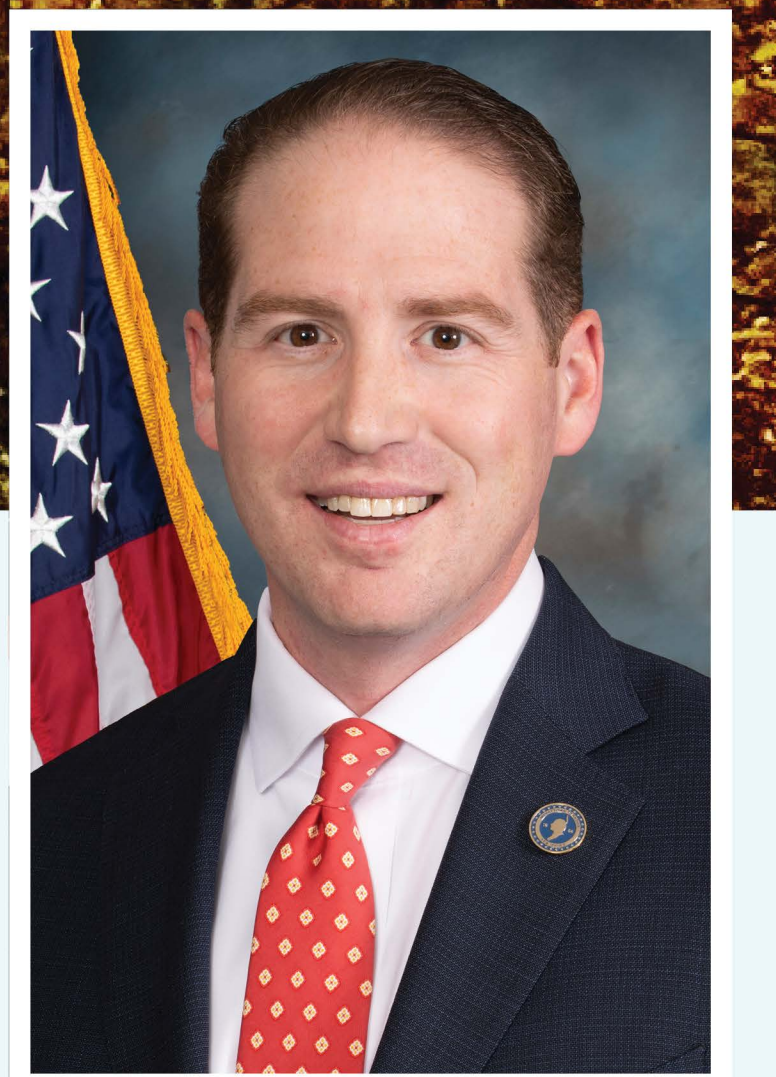




MIDDLETOWN MATTERS

Message from Mayor Tony Perry



I hope everyone enjoyed a wonderful summer on the Bayshore. Middletown was bustling with activity, and we look forward to continued momentum this fall. I'd like to share a few updates on recent projects and initiatives:

Preserving Open Space for the Future: The Township Committee recently approved the acquisition of the 15.4-acre former Lincroft Presbyterian Church property on Everett Road for open space preservation. The \$5.2 million purchase was made possible through the Monmouth County Open Space Trust Fund, which is covering 75 percent of the cost. The remaining \$1.3 million will come from Middletown's Open Space Trust Fund. I'm very proud that in a single year Middletown has added more than 100 acres of open space, including the 28-acre Mater Dei Park and the 67-acre Tretter property off Whipporwill Valley Road. We will continue to honor our commitment to safeguarding these spaces for future generations.

Upgrading the Middletown Senior Center: Significant improvements are also underway at the Middletown Senior Center in Leonardo to ensure our seniors have a modern, comfortable space to thrive in for many years to come. The \$1.3 million renovation includes a new HVAC system, energy efficient lighting, ADA accessibility upgrades, a new roof and windows, and refreshed interiors throughout the building. Due to ongoing construction, programs have been temporarily relocated to Croydon Hall Gym (900 Leonardville Road) and the Middletown Arts Center (36 Church Street). Honoring Our Veterans: On Sunday, November 2nd at 11:00 AM, we will celebrate the grand opening of Veterans Village at 37-45 Leonardville Road in Campbell's Junction. This long-anticipated project will provide 12 affordable housing units for veterans who have honorably served our nation. We are deeply grateful to the many organizations that have generously donated funds and essential items to help our veterans get what they need and make the community spaces feel like home. Following the grand opening, our annual Veterans Day Parade will step off from Bayview Elementary School (300 Leonardville Road) at 1:00 PM and end with a post-parade celebration at Mater Dei Park (538 Church Street) until 3:00 PM. I invite you to join us in honoring the heroes who have sacrificed so much for our freedom.

Supporting the WTC Memorial Gardens: In September, our first responders came together for the first annual 9/11 stair climb fundraiser to support the Middletown World Trade Center (WTC) Memorial Gardens. Participants climbed 110 floors — the height of the Twin Towers — raising over \$20,000 toward ongoing maintenance and improvements. Next year marks the 25th anniversary of September 11th, and the Township is investing \$1.2 million in enhancements to the Gardens, including new lighting, irrigation, brick pavers, and landscaping. Together, we continue to keep our promise to "Never Forget".

Tackling Rising Energy Costs: With electric bills rising nearly 20 percent, Middletown is taking proactive steps to help residents save money. The Township Committee has established a Government Energy Aggregation Program, which will allow us to leverage collective buying power to secure more competitive electricity rates. Neighboring towns will be invited to join the cooperative to maximize potential savings. Through this program, Middletown will oversee an energy auction conducted by a third-party provider to ensure the best rates for our community. Residents and businesses will be automatically enrolled but may opt out at any time without penalty. More details will be shared soon.

Middletown Remembers 24th Anniversary of 9/11

On Thursday, September 11th, Middletown
Township held a silent memorial and wreath
tribute at the Middletown World Trade Center
Memorial Gardens to honor the 37 residents we
lost 24 years ago and the individuals who have
passed since from 9/11-related illnesses.

Resident Mike Hannigan played the bagpipes
before the Middletown Township Police
Department’s Honor Guard and members of the
Middletown Township Committee, VFW Post
2179, and American Legion posts 338 and 515
officially began the ceremony with a wreath laying tribute. After the wreaths were placed,
Middletown Township Fire Chief Anthony Fulciniti rang a bell 37 times in memory of each
resident whose life was taken on that tragic day.

After the bell tolled, hundreds of people, including 9/11 victims' loved ones, Township
Committee members, local dignitaries, first responders, veterans, and community members,
lit candles and walked through the Gardens which were illuminated by luminarias.



Michael Quilty Recognized as 2024 Veteran of the Year

In July, Middletown Township was honored to
recognize Michael Quilty as the recipient of the
2024 Dennis J. Beauregard Veteran of the Year
Award. The award is based on documented
acts of selfless service and going the "extra mile"
beyond one’s post-military career.

As a committed member of the Middletown
Veterans Affairs Committee, Michael has worked
tirelessly to connect veterans with essential
resources such as housing, mental health care,
and addiction support.

Beyond his advocacy, Michael is a familiar face
in the community, known for announcing local
hockey games. His commitment to service, both
during his military career and as a resident, has left a lasting impact on Middletown.



ACCELERATED TAX SALE: DECEMBER 17, 2025

In New Jersey, all municipalities are required to hold at least one tax sale per year. **The 2025 Accelerated Tax Sale for the Township of Middletown will be an ELECTRONIC TAX SALE held on Wednesday, December 17, 2025, for DELINQUENT TAXES AND SEWER CHARGES.**

All properties sold at Tax Sale are for delinquent municipal charges for the tax year 2025 and
prior years. State law regarding the New Jersey Tax Sale process can be found in New Jersey
statutes: N.J.S.A 54:5-19 etc. The New Jersey statutes can be found at the Middletown Township
Public Library (55 New Monmouth Road) or online at njleg.state.nj.us.

Please note the Tax Sale process will begin automatically on Monday, November 10th at 3:45 PM.
Per this process, delinquencies will be subject to a 2% cost of sale (minimum \$15 but no more
than \$100). In addition, delinquencies will incur a mailing fee of \$25 per mailing. Two mailings
are scheduled for this process. THESE FEES ARE REQUIRED AS PART OF THE TAX SALE PROCESS AND
CANNOT BE WAIVED.

ALL payments received after November 10th at 3:45 PM for property taxes MUST be made using
guaranteed funds: attorney trust check, title company check, cashier’s check, cash, and/or
money order to remove the property from the Tax Sale process. Any other form of payment
WILL NOT be accepted. All other checks — online, personal, and business — WILL be returned.
Additionally, the credit card and ACH payment options WILL NOT be available after 3:45 PM on
November 10th.

During the spring, Middletown Township held two events to honor Joseph Murray, a Patriot who served in the Monmouth County militia as a soldier belonging to Colonel Asher Holmes' Regiment under the command of Lieutenant Garret Hendrickson in opposition to the British during the Revolutionary War. He lived in the Murray Farmhouse and Barn, located at Poricy Park (345 Oak Hill Road).



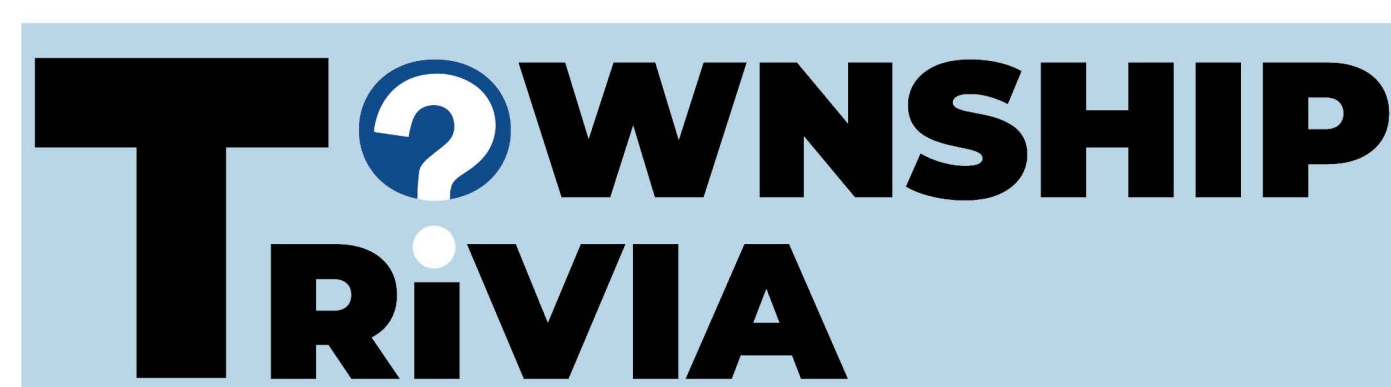
In May, Middletown Township participated in Monmouth County's two-day event "Weekend in Old Monmouth". On the first day, the Township held a rededication ceremony for the Murray Farmhouse to celebrate its recent renovations. The ceremony included Revolutionary War reenactors presenting the colors and performing a gun salute, as well as Girl Scout Troop #894 from Leonardo dressing in Colonial attire and teaching kids how to play games from that time period. There was also a petting zoo, tours, butter churning and bread tasting experience, and a Middletown America 250 Committee information table. During the event, Monmouth County Clerk Christine Hanlon surprised the Township Committee with Joseph Murray's framed pension certificate.



Recreation Department hosted Joseph Murray Day to honor the 245th anniversary of Joseph Murray's death.

The event included the Presentation of Colors and a 21-gun salute from the Middletown Township Police Department's Honor Guard, two proclamations, a poem recitation by Edward P. Manning, and a Middletown America 250 Committee information table.

Committeewoman Kimberly Kratz was honored to spend an afternoon with Girl Scout Troop 60598 from New Monmouth Elementary School during Women's History Month! The scouts discussed the importance of volunteering in your community and qualities that make a great leader. The following month, Mayor Perry had the pleasure of welcoming boy scouts from Pack 122 of New Monmouth Elementary School to Town Hall. While in the courtroom, they talked about the roles of the mayor and Township Committee and brainstormed ideas they'd love to see happen in town.



Township Committee Supports Local Nonprofits: In June, Mayor Perry and Deputy Mayor Rick Hibell were proud to attend Infinite Love for Kids Fighting Cancer's Annual Tutu Trot 5K Run/Walk. The goal of the Tutu Trot was to raise \$100,000 for the Children's Brain Tumor Network. That same month, Mayor Perry participated in the Annual Relay for Life of Middletown, which is the American Cancer Society's annual nationwide signature event. In September, Deputy Mayor Hibell, Committeeman Clarke, and Committeeman Kevin Settembrino joined hundreds of community members at the fourth annual Love for Luca 5K Walk/Run. The event was held in memory of Luca Iacono, a beloved 11-year-old resident who passed away from cancer in 2019. All proceeds were donated to Infinite Love for Kids Fighting Cancer.

Volunteers Partner to Clean Historic Cemeteries in Honor of Middletown America 250: Over the last few months, Middletown Landmarks Commissioner Roseann Eteson, the Middletown Community Affairs Council (CAC), and the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office have been hosting and participating in cemetery cleanups to honor the Revolutionary War heroes buried there. Middletown Recognizes Army Servicemen with Flag Presentation

In March, Mayor Tony Perry presented Army Special Forces Officer Nick Lavery with a certificate and flag that was flown at Town Hall to thank him for his service. Nick was a featured speaker at local business Whirl Construction's 2025 Annual Kick Off Luncheon.



Nick enlisted post-9/11, experienced multiple deployments to Iraq and Afghanistan, and was wounded on three different occasions. He is the first Special Forces operator to return to combat as an above-the-knee amputee, and is the recipient of a multitude of prestigious awards, including the Silver Star, three Purple Hearts, and two Bronze Stars.



At a Township Committee Meeting in May, the Township Committee surprised Sergeant First Class (SFC) Justin Laberde with a certificate and flag that was flown at Town Hall in his honor.

Born and raised in Middletown, SFC Laberde had just returned home after 21 years of active duty service in the United States Army. Driven by a deep sense of duty after 9/11, he graduated from high school a year early to serve our country. While stationed at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, he served two tours in Afghanistan as an Explosive Ordnance Disposal technician.

Township Committee and Middletown Chapter of DAR Celebrate Three Local Students

In June, the Township Committee and the Middletown chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) recognized three outstanding students.

During a Township Committee Meeting, Mayor Tony Perry presented Angelee Keiser, Grace Wahl, and Ella Hilton with Youth Leadership Awards and DAR representatives gave them DAR Youth Citizenship Award Medals to recognize them for making a difference in our community.



Angelee, a student at Middletown High School North and a Middletown Township Police Cadet, was nominated by Sergeant Ric Cruz for her involvement in law enforcement, public service, and local events. Grace and Ella, both students at Bayshore Middle School at that time and members of Girl Scout Troop 60173, were nominated by the Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore for their ongoing leadership and contributions to local initiatives. A few months prior to the presentation, they worked together to organize a relief drive for those affected by Hurricane Helene in North Carolina.

Middletown First Responders Emphasize the Dangers of Drinking and Driving to High School Students

The Middletown Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Department, Middletown Township Fire Department (MTFD), and Middletown Township Police Department participated in the annual Rude Awakening Program at Middletown high schools North and South in May.

The program aims to educate juniors and seniors about the dangers of impaired and distracted driving through a simulated motor vehicle

accident scene, complete with emergency medical response, fire department extrication, and police investigation. The goal of the program is for students to gain a deeper understanding of the real-world impact of their decisions behind the wheel.

Monmouth County Promotes Know Your Zone Program

In September, Monmouth County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Coordinator Scott Nielson, Monmouth County Sheriff Shaun Golden, and members of the Monmouth County Board of Commissioners proudly unveiled 18 new "Know Your Zone" signs to Mayor Tony Perry and Middletown's OEM Department. The signs will be placed throughout the township to help educate the public on their specific level of risk from storm surge and coastal flooding.

HELP SAVE LIVES BY VOLUNTEERING WITH EMS



The Middletown EMS Department is comprised of five all-volunteer first aid squads. These dedicated teams provide 24/7 coverage, ensuring the health and safety of our community around the clock. In 2024, the EMS Department responded to approximately 7,000 emergency medical calls, with an average of 20 per day.

Reasons to Volunteer:

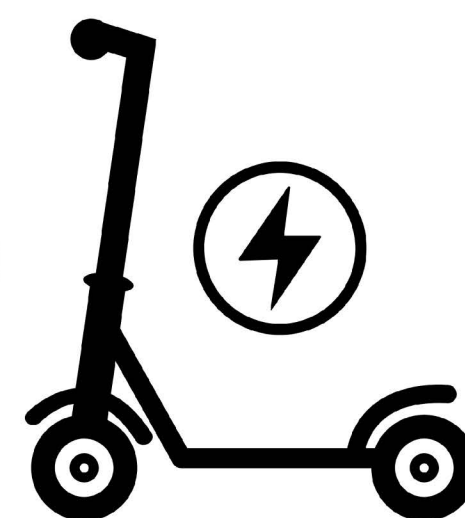

Monmouth County and Middletown Announce Road Improvements in Lincroft

In June, Monmouth County and Middletown Township elected officials gathered to break ground on the roadway behind the Acme shopping plaza. The new two-way roadway will replace the current one-way service road behind the shopping center. Vehicles and pedestrians on Middletown-Lincroft Road will now have direct access to the shopping center, which will reduce the volume of traffic and improve traffic safety on Newman Springs Road. A sidewalk will also be installed to promote walkability. The project is anticipated to be done by the end of the year, weather permitting.



During the groundbreaking, Mayor Tony Perry proudly announced that the new roadway will be named after Abe Littenberg, a longtime Lincroft resident. Abe serves on the Lincroft Village Green Association Board of Directors and is a passionate advocate for safer streets. Over the summer, the County also reduced the speed limit between Hurleys Lane and Woodland Drive to 35 mph. These improvements are a result of two public input sessions that were hosted by the Township and County to discuss Newman Springs Road/County Road 520 traffic safety improvements.

MTPD Remembers Fallen Officers and Pays Tribute to Beloved K-9

In May, the MTPD held its annual Police Memorial Service during National Police Week, marking the department's 97th anniversary.

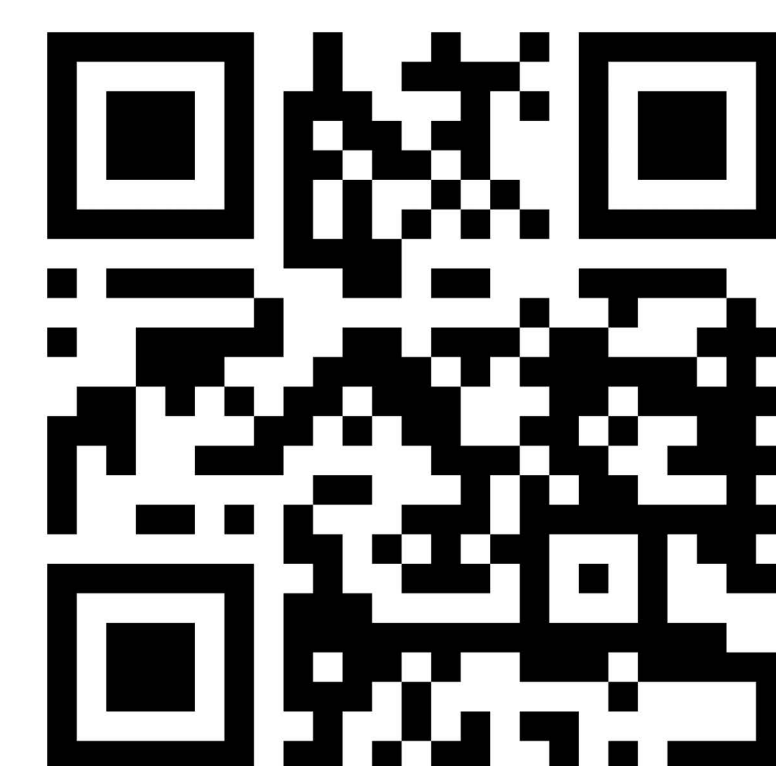

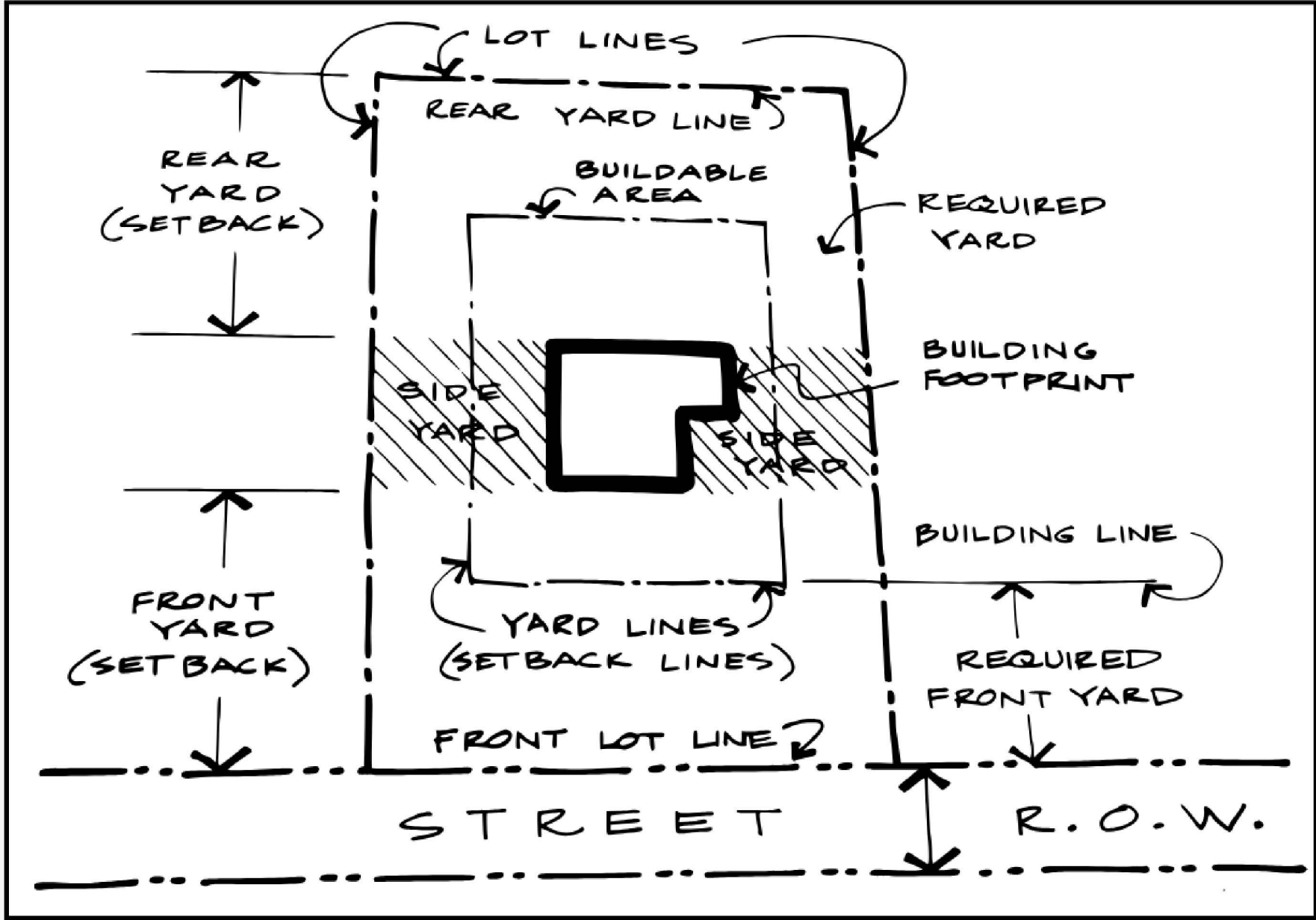

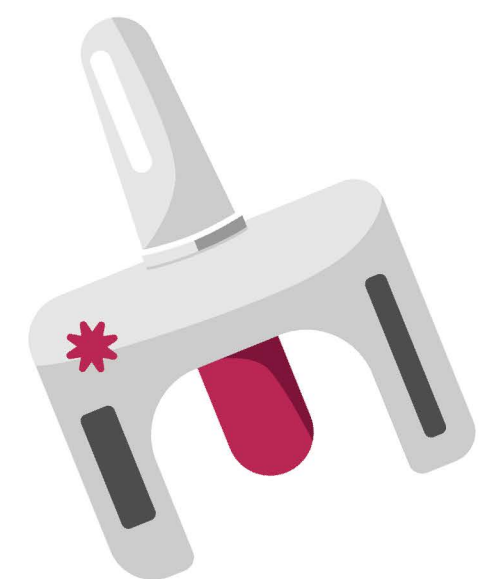

Learn How to Respond to Opioid Overdoses with Naloxone/Narcan Administration

Over the summer, the Middletown Alliance and JSAS HealthCare, Inc. partnered to host two trainings on overdose response and naloxone/Narcan administration: one for the public and one for Township employees.



Participants learned about substance and opioid use disorders, the signs of an overdose, the steps to respond, and how to administer naloxone/Narcan and rescue breaths. Those who attended received an overdose response kit that included gloves, a rescue breath mask, and two doses of naloxone nasal spray.

Place sharps into a puncture-resistant, heavy-duty plastic container. **DO NOT** use glass bottles or water bottles with flimsy lids. When the container is 3/4 full, put the lid on, seal with duct tape, and label it "DO NOT RECYCLE". Place the plastic container in the household trash. Sharps should never be recycled or thrown loosely into the trash or toilet.

PORT MONMOUTH FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT UPDATE

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' flood control project continues along Comptons Creek as well as Route 36 in Port Monmouth where the floodwall and levee are being constructed to complete the line of defense. Contract 4b, which includes the levee and floodwall from Broadway to Route 36, as well as road closure gates at Campbell Avenue and Broadway, is the last structural piece of this major flood risk management project.



Floodwall construction continues along Route 36.

The newly constructed stormwater pumping station on Main Street is currently being tested and the State of New Jersey is being trained on how to operate the facility. The raised Port Monmouth Road was completed and is now open to traffic while Broadway and Campbell Avenue will be closed at times in order to complete the flood protection perimeter.

Previous portions of the project are already defending residents against significant flooding and property damage. These completed elements consist of a floodwall along Port Monmouth Road, a road closure gate at Old Port Monmouth Road, raised Port Monmouth Road, levee and floodwall along Main Street, and a pump station and floodgate in Pews Creek. The entire Port Monmouth Flood Control Project is expected to be completed in 2028.

Residents can bring leaves to the Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kaness Lane) from November 1st until June 1st. Brush is accepted year-round for residents.
