Monday's Township Committee Regular Meeting was an eventful night for the Middletown Township Police Department (MTPD)! Mayor Tony Perry had the honor of kicking off the meeting by promoting Lt. James Prosinski who has proudly served the MTPD for over 33 years.

The meeting continued with Mayor Perry swearing in Officers Peter Bracken, Bryan Flannigan, Christopher Glietz, Adrianna Lanfranco, Peter McGovern, Darren Schwedes, and Justin Skelly. MTPD Chief R. Craig Weber also recognized Officer Sarah Derasmo for receiving the Academic Award, Marksmanship Award, and Outstanding Trainee Award from the Monmouth County Police Academy.

Lastly, Mayor Perry presented valor awards to Officers Eric Van Schaack, Nicholas Manochio, Tony Perito, and Sergeant Erica Weeks. Officers Eric Van Schaack and Nicholas Manochio worked together this past July when responding to a 911 call where two people were being stabbed while protecting a small child from harm. The two officers had to courageously take matters into their own hands and use defensive tactics to stop the knife-wielding actor. After the suspect was arrested,

they provided medical assistance with the help of Sergeant Erica Weeks who utilized tourniquets and provided both physical and emotional assistance to the victims.

Officer Tony Perito was recognized for risking his life, while off duty and traveling with his family, during an armed robbery that took place at a rest stop. When he noticed three suspicious actors behaving in a disorderly manner, he intervened.

The suspects assaulted him and fled the scene, but Officer Perito relayed the information to the responding troopers which resulted in a traffic stop where the actors were placed under arrest. We are incredibly grateful for Officer Perito's heroic actions and bravery.

We are so proud to recognize the MTPD for all they do to protect our community, and thank them for their hard work.

This three-acre property, located in the North Middletown section of the township, is one of the few pieces of open space left along State Highway 36.

LEAF COLLECTION ONLY – NO BRUSH UNTIL SPRING!

DO NOT SET OUT LEAVES AFTER YOUR STREET HAS BEEN COLLECTED – Violators will be charged up to \$1,250 for an individual collection. Do not place material at the curb earlier than 7 days before start date. Brush, tree stumps, lumber, plywood, fence posts, railroad ties, or garbage will not be collected. Residents can bring leaves to the Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kaness Lane) from November 1st until June 1st. Brush is accepted year-round for residents.

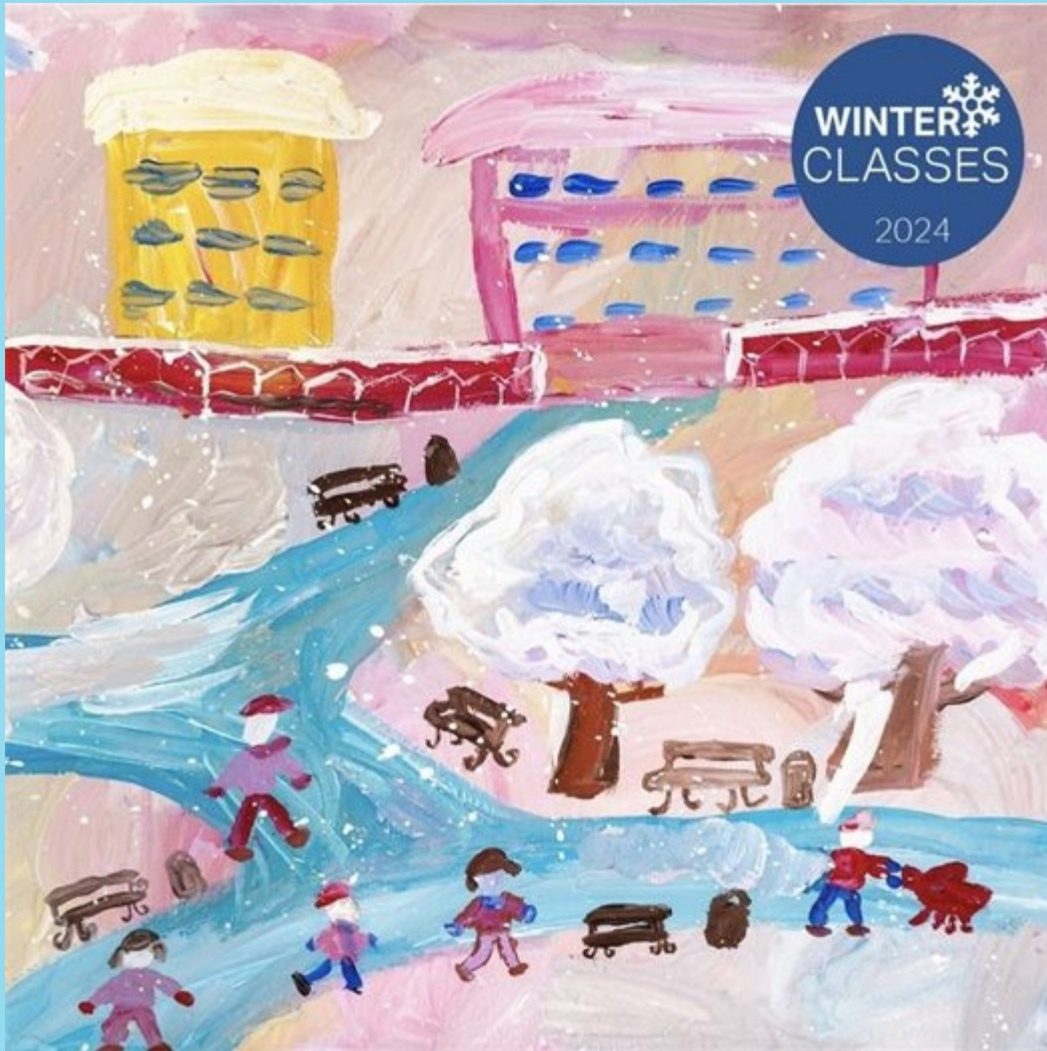
Please note that the School's Out Day Camp will be closed on Tuesday, December 26th but Snapology Day Off Camp with full- and half-day options will be offered.

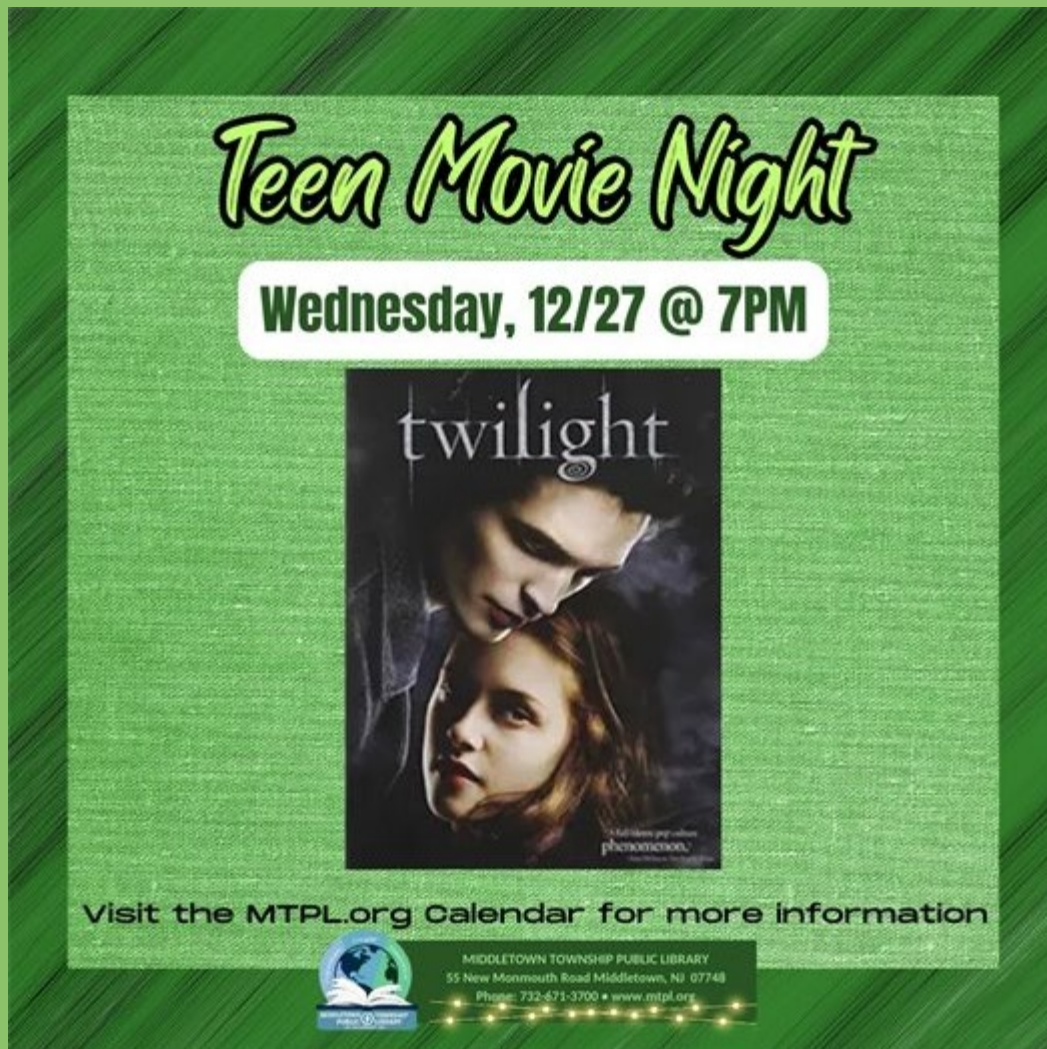
Register Now for MAC's Winter Classes!

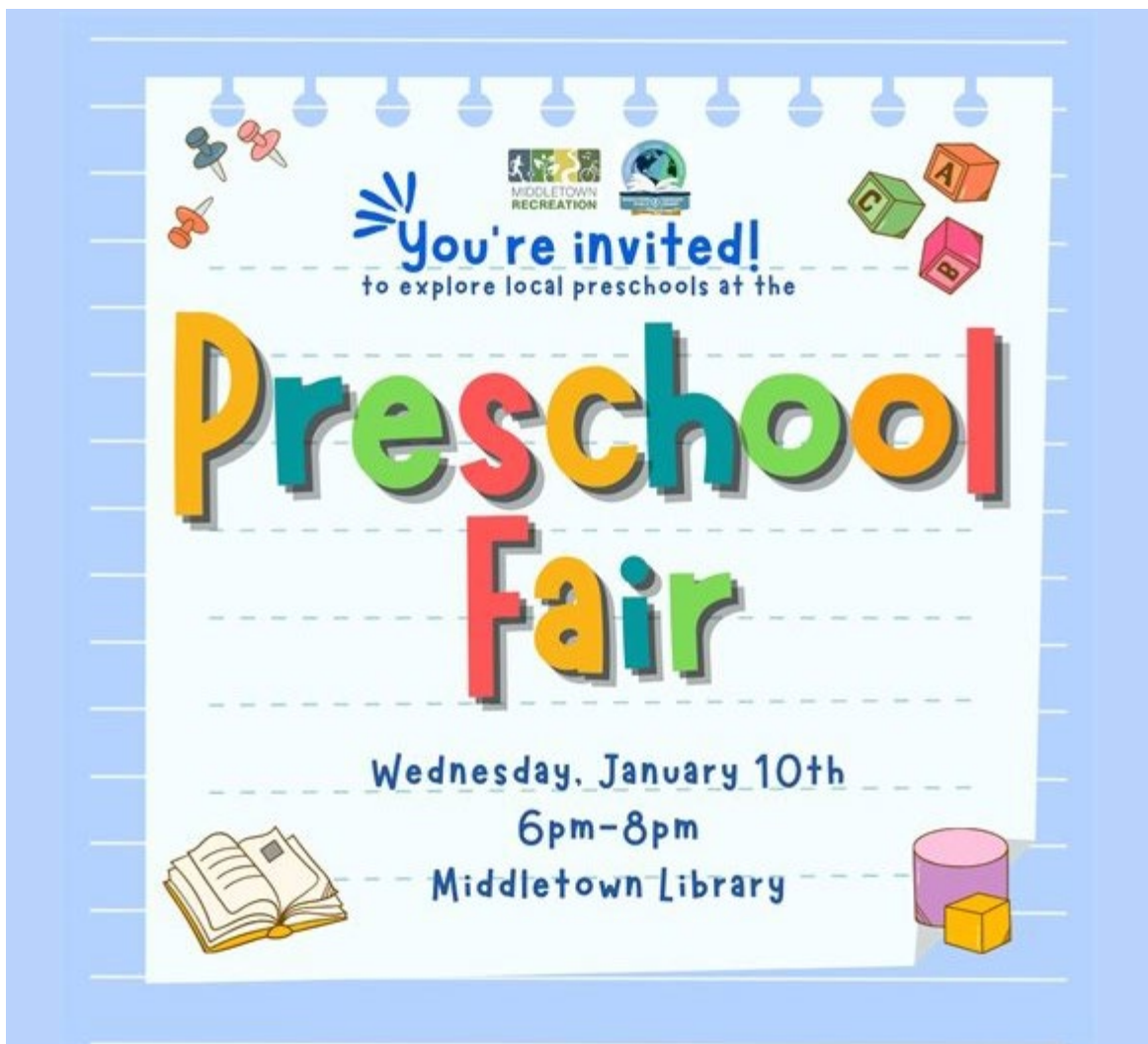
**Lights, Camera, Action! Enjoy a Family Movie at MTPL on

- Enter your 2024 assessment
- Click "Calculate"
- Subtract the amount you were billed for 2023 property taxes from the estimated figure
- Number will indicate the 2024 increase/decrease

The 2020 ANCHOR Benefit Filing Deadline for new applicants is December 29, 2023. If you qualified for a rebate last year, you should have already received a letter confirming you are eligible.
