In April, New Jersey Audubon (NJA), a private, not-for-profit, membership organization founded in 1897 with a focus on connecting people with nature and stewarding nature for future generations throughout New Jersey, announced the transfer of the 90-acre Scudder Preserve in Middletown Township to Monmouth Conservation Foundation (MCF), a nonprofit land trust focused on preserving open space throughout Monmouth County.

“I am very grateful to the Monmouth Conservation Foundation, especially board members Valerie Montecalvo and Jennifer Beck, who helped champion the continued preservation of the historic Scudder property,” said Mayor Tony Perry. “Middletown will continue to partner with both government agencies and nonprofit organizations to maintain and protect Middletown’s quality of life.”



OVERVIEW

The Monmouth County Sheriff's Office is updating its Hazard Mitigation Plan. Hazard mitigation planning identifies risks and vulnerabilities associated with natural disasters and develops long-term strategies for protecting people and property from future hazard events. Updates are required every five (5) years in order for communities in Monmouth County to be eligible for certain types of state and federal disaster relief funds after a disaster occurs.

PUBLIC WORKSHOP

The Project Team is engaging with the public via a workshop to understand unique assets that should be protected, the hazards we face, and findings from the risk assessment. Questions we may discuss include:

- Where are the hazards experienced?
- What are your biggest concerns?
- What are your recommendations for hazard mitigation?

Middletown Fire Prevention Reminds Residents About Lithium-Ion Battery Safety

Lithium-Ion Battery Safety

Lithium-ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode.

The problem

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F (40°C).
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, or odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call 9-1-1.

Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.

Charging an E-bike

Charge your battery in a flat, dry area away from children, direct sunlight, liquids, tripping hazards, and in a location where the e-bike is not at risk of falling.



Middletown Township Offers Grants Up to \$60K to Create Accessory Apartments

Middletown Township permits owners of single-family residential dwellings to create an accessory apartment on their property for low and moderate income households. It can be either in an accessory building (i.e., a second story apartment over a detached garage) or within the single-family dwelling.

The Middletown Accessory Apartment Program is now offering grants up to \$60K to help build the apartment. Prospective tenants must be selected through a lottery system from applicants in the Middletown Township Affordable Housing Database.

TIPS FOR CONTACT WITH ANIMALS



FAWNS

TIP #1
"If you care, leave it there"
A fawn will be left alone on lawns, in flower beds, and in tree lines for most of the day. The baby is best left undisturbed.

TIP #2
Mom is usually close by monitoring the situation. The fawn will move very little and sometimes not at all.

TIP #3
Mom will return in the late afternoon or early evening to feed and pick up her fawn.

TIP #4
If the fawn seems injured or in distress, please contact Animal Control to assess the situation.







Monmouth County to Treat Curbside Catch Basins in Middletown on Thursday, 6/20 from 4-7 PM

The Monmouth County Division of Mosquito Control has initiated a program to treat stormwater catch basins in the streets of select neighborhoods with

either a history of or current indication of West Nile virus activity. A catch basin continuously holding a bit of water is classic habitat for Culex mosquitoes known to amplify West Nile virus. The purpose of this preventative effort is to squelch mosquito production in these basins. There is no evidence of West Nile virus activity anywhere in the county at this time.

On Thursday, June 20th between 4:00 and 7:00 PM, the Monmouth County Division of Mosquito Control will be treating the curbside catch basins in a section of Middletown.

How to Report a Neighborhood Safety Concern

The Safety Council of Middletown would like to hear from residents about any safety concerns that may be occurring in their neighborhood.

The Safety Council is an advisory board that reviews safety concerns in the township and provides guidance to the Township Committee and the Police Department. Some safety issues the board can help address include:

- **Speeding**

- **Parking on busy roads that impact traffic flow**
- **Roads that flood from little rainfall**
- **Traffic not adhering to crosswalk or stop signs**
- **Trees and branches that are limiting passage on sidewalks**
- **Sidewalks that are uprooted or damaged that could cause someone to fall**
- **Unusual amount of traffic or people congregating at a specific house in your neighborhood that could indicate possible illegal activity**
- **Garbage piling up on side roads or on a lot in your neighborhood**

If you would like a safety issue addressed, please inform the Council so they can help you achieve a successful outcome.
