**Technical Information Session for Owners of Property Within Campbell's Junction Redevelopment Study Area to be Held at Town Hall on Monday, 2/10 at 7 PM**

Middletown Township will be holding a technical information session for owners of property within the Campbell's Junction Redevelopment Study Area on Monday, February 10<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM in the Training Room at Town Hall (1 Kings Highway). The Study Area is located along Leonardville Road from Church Street to East Road in Belford and is comprised of approximately 73 properties and about 34 acres. All property owners should have received a mailed invitation to the session in January.

The purpose of this information session is to explain the process of a Redevelopment Investigation as per the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law. The purpose of the Redevelopment Study is to assess whether properties in the Study Area meet statutory criteria for designation as an area in need of redevelopment for *non-condemnation* purposes. This is an important tool that can be used to stimulate neighborhood improvements within a designated area.

After the study is complete, it will be presented at a Planning Board hearing for adoption. Based on the results of the investigation study and Planning Board hearing, it is expected that the Township will conduct broader public outreach for input regarding the vision and needs of Campbell's Junction.



**NJAW Lead Service Line Replacement Program  
Door-to-Door Canvassing Continues**

CDM Smith, on behalf of New Jersey American Water (NJAW), started a door-to-door canvassing effort related to the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) in Middletown on Monday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>. The canvassing and internal inspections are currently taking place in Area 1 on the map above. The entire canvassing is expected to take place over the next few months.

All CDM Smith inspectors will wear co-branded (NJAW and CDM Smith) high visibility logo vests and will have NJAW-issued Contractor ID badges. Inspectors will introduce themselves and the program to property owners and will then ask to enter the home to inspect the water service where it enters into the home (typically in a basement or crawl space).

The inspector will take exterior photos of the property and interior photographs of the service material and record the pipe material identified. Inspections generally take 15 minutes or less. At no time will residents be asked for money. Any customer that prefers to not have an internal inspection completed will be directed to

alternatives to the inspections including self-reporting.



Middletown Township is now utilizing the “See-Click-Fix” platform so residents can easily contact the Township to report any concerns. The Township is branding this reporting tool as *Connect & Correct* since you can submit your request via the website and track its progress through completion.

Simply choose the relevant category from the list such as lost pet, pothole, sidewalks, playgrounds, etc. and add a brief description of the issue. You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.

In February, the Township will be launching the *Connect & Correct* app which should make it even easier to report your concerns on-the-go as well as streamline





TRAFFIC SAFETY & DETOURS  
MIDDLETOWN TOWNSHIP

- Chapel Hill Road at Whippoorwill Valley Road will be closed for construction from Monday, February 10<sup>th</sup> through Friday, February 14<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 AM to

**5:00 PM. A detour has been set. Properties 1 through 230 will have access from NJ-35. Properties 231 through 400 will have access from Kings Highway East. School buses will still have access throughout the construction.**

- **Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic through October, but pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project.**
- **As of Monday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, Broadway is closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to construction of the final phase of the US Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project. Broadway will be closed for approximately 2 years. Detours were posted. Port Monmouth Road between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) reopened on Monday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, providing an alternate detour route for the Broadway closure.**

## **New Jersey American Water Plans for Routine Maintenance at Swimming River & Jumping Brook Water Treatment Plants Beginning Week of 2/17**

**As part of an annual routine maintenance program, New Jersey American Water (NJAW) will temporarily change the water treatment process at its Swimming River Water Treatment Plant in Colts Neck and its Jumping Brook Water Treatment Plant in Neptune. The maintenance will take place the week of Monday, February 17<sup>th</sup> through mid-April, and consists of temporarily shifting from using chloramine to free chlorine.**

**This routine, annual change in treatment helps ensure the continued safety and reliability of water quality throughout the distribution system. During this period, some customers may notice a slight taste and smell of chlorine in their water. This**

is normal and will only be temporary until the system maintenance is complete. If customers experience this, the company suggests placing water in an uncovered pitcher in the refrigerator overnight to allow the chlorine to dissipate.

Throughout the maintenance period, NJAW will continue to monitor water quality in the system to provide water to customers that meets or surpasses federal and state drinking water standards.

## How to Protect Your Pipes During the Colder Months

### AVOID FROZEN PIPES THIS WINTER

Before the cold sets in, locate your main water shut-off valve and hang an I.D. tag on it so you can find it quickly in an emergency. In many homes, it is located near the water meter or close to where the water pipe enters the home. Note: If your pipes do freeze, you will need to be able to turn off your water immediately. Do NOT attempt to thaw the pipes without doing so.

We recommend that you locate and test your main water shut-off valve.



It's a good idea to test your main water shut-off valve to be sure it works properly. To test, slowly close it. If you have a ball valve, it generally only requires a quarter turn to close. Gate valves are generally closed by turning the handle clockwise and should turn easily. You may need to have it serviced if it does not close easily.

Once the shut-off valve is completely closed, check sinks and other water fixtures to make sure you found the main water valve and that it is working properly. If no water comes out of any faucets, CONGRATULATIONS, you found your shut-off valve! See more tips to the right.



If pipes run through cabinets or vanities, open the doors to let warmer room temperatures flow in.

Protect your pipes. Wrap them with insulation or heat tape before cold weather sets in.

Check sprinkler or irrigation systems. Make sure everything is turned off and drained.

Eliminate sources of cold air near water lines and fix drafts around windows and doors.

When temperatures stay below freezing, keep water moving through the pipes by allowing a small trickle of water to run.

In addition to avoiding frozen pipes, it is also important to keep in mind that you should not pour fats, oils, or grease down the drain. You should dispose of them in the trash instead. This tip should be practiced year-round, but is especially relevant during the holiday season when family and friends tend to be gathering together for meals more often.

## Prepare Your Home for Winter Storms with Flood Insurance and Precautionary Steps



Middletown Floodplain Management encourages residents to purchase flood insurance and winterize their homes by insulating walls and attics, caulking and weather-stripping doors and windows, and installing storm windows or covering windows with plastic.

Remember to clear rain gutters, repair roof leaks, and cut away tree branches that could fall on a house or neighboring structure during or following a storm. Keep pathways and driveways clear between storms to avoid buildup of snow piles and icing. Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.

## **VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETON**

Middletown Township has an ordinance that requires owners of a business or vacant and abandoned property to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts and omissions.

The ordinance holds property owners responsible for maintaining and securing the property since vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties can cause a cycle of neighborhood deterioration. The ordinance penalizes owners whose property remains vacant year after year.

## **HOW TO REGISTER OR REPORT VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY**
