



Middletown High School North Wrestling Program Celebrates 2025 Shore Conference B-Division Championship at Township Committee Meeting



Township Committee Proclaims March as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month



At the Township Committee Meeting on Monday, Mayor Tony Perry also presented a proclamation recognizing March 2025 as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month to resident Bonnie Woodward. Bonnie is a registered nurse at Red Bank Gastroenterology and a passionate advocate. She continues to raise awareness as a healthcare professional and as someone who has lost her mother, friends, and patients to this disease.

While accepting the proclamation, Bonnie urged members of our community to schedule their colonoscopies if they are 45 years of age or older. Colorectal cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States among men and women combined. It is one of the few cancers that can be prevented with a timely screening.

This Saturday, March 8th, there will be a free colorectal cancer awareness event

held at the Grand Arcade, located inside the Asbury Park Convention Hall (1300 Ocean Avenue), from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM. There will be cancer screening education and referrals available.



NJAW Lead Service Line Replacement Program Door-to-Door Canvassing Continues

CDM Smith, on behalf of New Jersey American Water (NJAW), started a door-to-door canvassing effort related to the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) in Middletown on Monday, February 3rd. The canvassing and internal inspections are currently taking place in Area 1, which is the Harmony Elementary School District, on the map above. The entire canvassing is expected to take place over the next few months.

All CDM Smith inspectors will wear co-branded (NJAW and CDM Smith) high visibility logo vests and will have NJAW-issued Contractor ID badges. Inspectors will introduce themselves and the program to property owners and will then ask to enter the home to inspect the water service where it enters into the home (typically in a basement or crawl space).

The inspector will take exterior photos of the property and interior photographs of the service material and record the pipe material identified. Inspections generally take 15 minutes or less. At no time will residents be asked for money. Any customer

that prefers to not have an internal inspection completed will be directed to alternatives to the inspections including self-reporting.





- Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic through October, but pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project.
- As of Monday, January 13th, Broadway is closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to construction of the final phase of the US Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project. Broadway will be closed for approximately 2 years. Detours were posted. Port Monmouth Road between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) reopened on Monday, January 13th, providing an alternate detour route for the Broadway closure.



Middletown Township Animal Control Provides Information About Raccoon Behavior in Spring

How Raccoons Behave in Spring

Presented by Middletown Township Animal Control




Right now, raccoons are starting to seek their partner, become pregnant, and search for their new home. Most raccoons will seek out hollow trees and abandoned fox dens, but some may find an empty space in your attic or crawlspace. Raccoons don't know that this is your home and that they aren't supposed to be there. The mother raccoon is looking for a safe, warm place to keep her babies.

Please take the proper steps to ensure animals can't access any part of your home:

- Keep your garbage can sealed
- Don't leave pet food outside
- Inspect your roof and attic and seal any gaps or holes
- Install proper vents (including chimney caps)
- Remove any tree branches that may provide access to your roof
- Secure window wells (typically found near basement windows)



RACCOONS ACTIVE DURING THE DAY

During the spring months, if you see raccoons active in the daytime it does not necessarily mean that they have rabies. Instead, it is likely that they are foraging for food to feed their young.

Regardless, it is always important to be cautious around wild animals. Rabies is a fatal virus and you should ALWAYS avoid handling or approaching them under any circumstances. Rabies can be transmitted through a bite, scratch, or saliva. If you notice any signs or symptoms from the animal that may warrant a concern, such as neurological impairment, loss of balance and motor skills, extremely aggressive or docile behavior, and self-inflicted wounds, please keep your distance and contact Animal Control or the Middletown Township Police Department.

THINKING ABOUT BUILDING AN IN-GROUND POOL IN TIME FOR THE SUMMER? BEST TO START THE PERMIT PROCESS NOW!



Stop by the Planning, Zoning & Community Development Office at Town Hall (1 Kings Highway) to meet with the Zoning Officer for a Development Permit Application. You will need a property survey that shows the proposed location of your pool and any other associated improvements such as a patio or cabana.

Connect with the Township to Help Correct Concerns



Middletown Township is now utilizing the “See-Click-Fix” platform so residents can easily contact the Township to report any concerns. The Township is branding this reporting tool as *Connect & Correct* since you can submit your request via the website and track its progress through completion.

Visit middletownnj.org and click on the *Connect & Correct* button. This link will direct you to a page of categories you can choose from to report your concern.

Simply choose the relevant category from the list such as lost pet, pothole, sidewalks, playgrounds, etc. and add a brief description of the issue. You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.

The Township will soon be launching the *Connect & Correct* app which should make it even easier to report your concerns on-the-go as well as streamline communications regarding any concerns you may have.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

Middletown Township has an ordinance that requires owners of a business or vacant and abandoned property to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts and omissions.

The ordinance holds property owners responsible for maintaining and securing the property since vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties can cause a cycle of neighborhood deterioration. The ordinance penalizes owners whose property remains vacant year after year.


