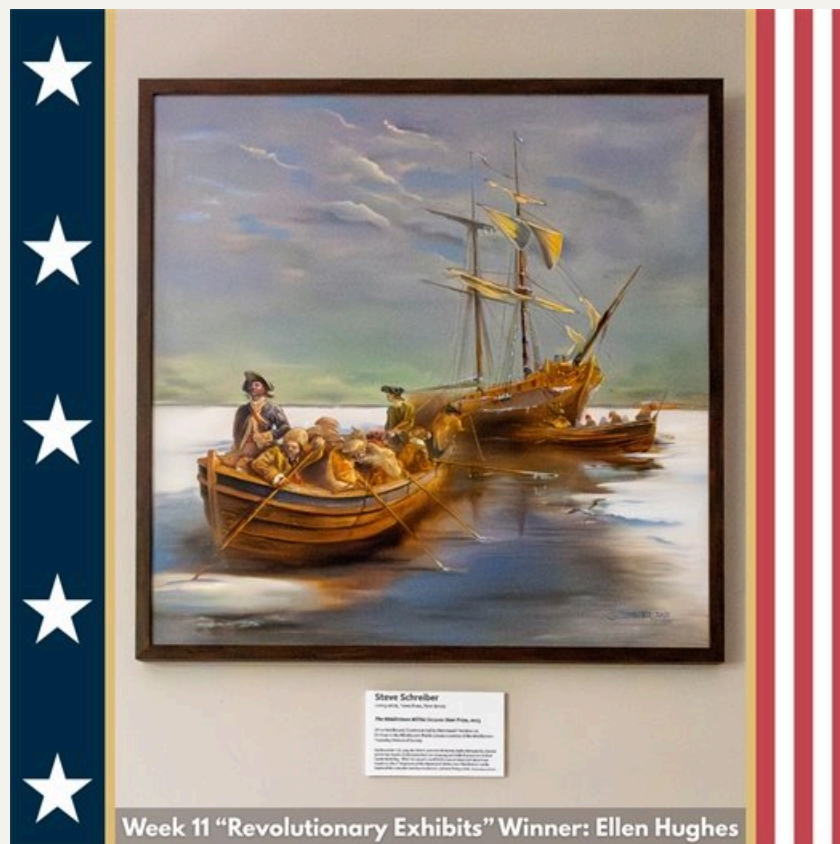

Volunteers Give Hartshorne Cemetery Some TLC

On Friday, September 19th, Middletown Landmarks Commissioner Roseann Eteson and local volunteer Jamie DeRisi dedicated the morning to cleaning up downed tree limbs in Hartshorne Cemetery (57 Kings Highway).

This historic cemetery remains owned and maintained by the Hartshorne family. The land was originally owned by Richard Hartshorne, a Quaker from England, who arrived in America in 1669, and likely settled in Rhode Island before moving to Middletown around 1670. Hartshorne is recognized as one of the earliest European settlers to Middletown.

During his lifetime, Hartshorne became one of the largest landowners in the region, holding over 2,400 acres that encompassed Sandy Hook and the Navesink Highlands.

This cleanup was part of an ongoing effort to highlight our historic landmark cemeteries where Revolutionary War Patriots are buried as part of Middletown's America 250 initiative. Private Timothy Murphy who served in the Monmouth Militia is buried here. Murphy was married to Mary Garrison, Richard Hartshorne's great-granddaughter, and died in 1812.

The Middletown Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will be hosting a two-part workshop at the Middletown Township Public Library (55 New Monmouth Road) called "Researching Revolutionary War Patriots in Your Family Tree". Registration is required.

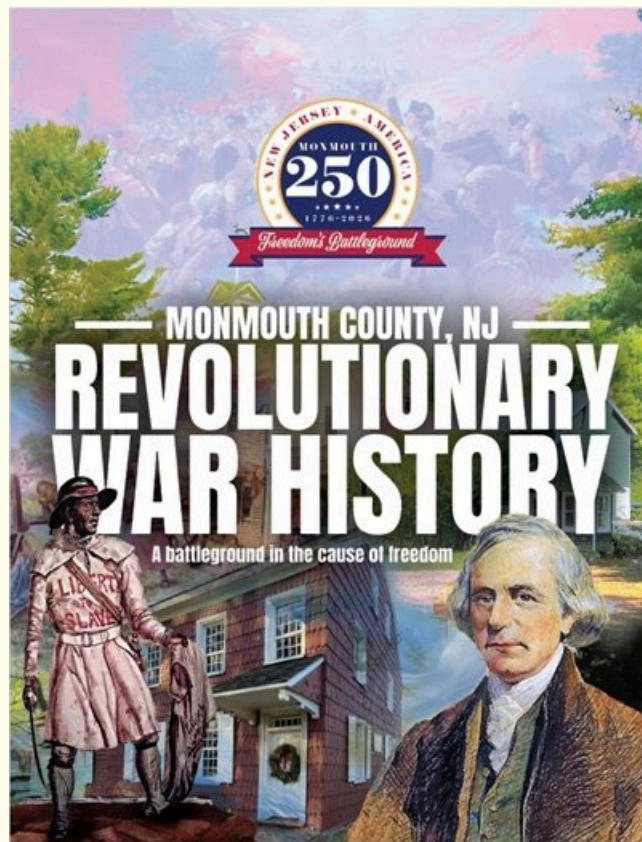
Part 1 will take place on Tuesday, September 30th and will focus on how to add yourself to Family Search and connect your family into the public tree. For the class, you'll need to come prepared with the names on your family tree, date and

place of birth, and date and place of death for each one of your parents and your four grandparents.

Part 2 of the workshop will take place on Tuesday, October 21st. Once you are connected into the public tree, you will use that tree in conjunction with the DAR's Genealogical Research System to identify any potential Revolutionary War ancestors. This workshop will only help you identify a potential branch of the tree to explore further. Once a candidate ancestor is identified, traditional genealogy techniques will be required to prove that line.

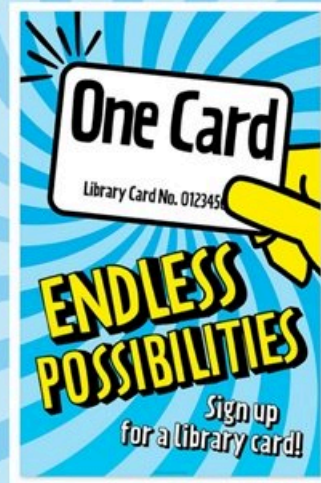

Concept Development Study for Operational Safety Improvements to South Laurel Avenue (CR 52) at the Railroad Bridge

Townships of Holmdel and Middletown, Monmouth County

Monmouth County, in cooperation with the New Jersey Department of Transportation, will be hosting a virtual Public Information Center (PIC) meeting to update residents, officials, businesses and the public about the Concept Development Study for the Operational Safety Improvements to South Laurel Avenue (CR 52) at the Railroad Bridge, located in the Townships of Holmdel and Middletown.


The purpose of the PIC is to update the public about the development of alternatives and potential options for the Preliminary Preferred Alternative (PPA) to satisfy the Study's Purpose and Need Statement.

The PIC will be held virtually on the County's website via a prerecorded presentation. The presentation will review existing conditions, deficiencies, and constraints at the Railroad Bridge and within the project limits, and explain the proposed alternatives developed by the Study Team. This meeting is being conducted in conformance with Federal and State regulations. All members of the public are invited and encouraged to comment on the Study.

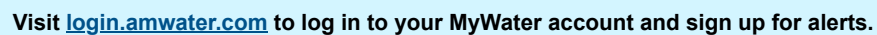
Monmouth County is currently advancing a Concept Development (CD) Study for improvements to South Laurel Avenue from Commons Way to AT&T Drive in the townships of Middletown and Holmdel. Middletown Wellness Wheels, which is funded through a portion of the Opioid Settlement Funds awarded by the state, provides free local transportation for residents with substance use disorders, at risk of substance use disorders, or those who need access to mental health services. Middletown Township is the first municipality in Monmouth County to utilize the settlement funds in this manner.

TRAFFIC SAFETY & DETOURS

MIDDLETOWN  TOWNSHIP

- On Friday, September 19th, Navesink River Road will be closed between NJ-35 and McClees Road from 6:00 PM - 6:00 AM for milling and paving.
- On Sunday, September 21st, there will be road closures on Tindall Road northbound, Park Avenue eastbound, East Road southbound, and Swartzel

Drive westbound due to the annual Love for Luca 5K Run/Walk. Please avoid the area.

- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. Please follow all posted signs and stay alert while driving in the area, as temporary changes to traffic patterns may occur. [Click HERE](#) to read the County's press release for more information.
- Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary's School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic through October, but pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project.
- As of Monday, January 13th, Broadway is closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to construction of the final phase of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project. Broadway will be closed for approximately two years. Detours were posted. Port Monmouth Road between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) reopened on Monday, January 13th, providing an alternate detour route for the Broadway closure.

WHAT TO DO WITH SHARPS?

DISPOSING AT HOME

- 1 Place sharps into a heavy-duty plastic container. The bottle should be sturdy, puncture-resistant, and should not leak. Do not use glass bottles or water bottles with flimsy lids.
- 2 When the container is $\frac{3}{4}$ full, put the lid on, seal it with duct tape, and label it "DO NOT RECYCLE".
- 3 Put the plastic container in the household trash. Sharps should never be recycled or thrown loosely into the trash or toilet.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT GETTING YOUR HURRICANE SUPPLIES





- 1

Food/Water - Get supplies well in advance, enough for each person for at least one week.


- 2

Medicine/First-aid - Have 30 days worth of medicines and medical supplies. Fill prescriptions before the storm.


- 3

Communications - Have extra batteries or portable chargers for your cell phones and batteries for your radios.


- 4

Gas - Fill up your car or a gas can beforehand. If the power goes out, you will be unable to pump gas.


- 5

Money - Have cash on hand. With no electricity, ATMs and credit cards will not work.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

Middletown Township has an ordinance that requires owners of a business or vacant and abandoned property to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts and omissions.

The ordinance holds property owners responsible for maintaining and securing the property since vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties can cause a cycle of neighborhood deterioration. The ordinance penalizes owners whose property remains vacant year after year.
