A strong Nor'easter is forecast to bring heavy rain, winds out of the northeast up to 60 mph, and coastal flooding to our area on Sunday morning through Monday evening. Low-lying and waterfront roads may become impassable, and power outages are possible due to wind, downed trees, and storm stress.

Township officials met earlier this afternoon to prepare in advance of the storm. First responders — Police, Fire, EMS, and OEM — will be fully staffed and on standby throughout the event. All critical equipment, vehicles, pumps, and generators have been inspected, fueled, and are ready for deployment.

- Ensure carbon monoxide alarms are functioning in all businesses/homes while using a generator



MTFD Battles Second Alarm Structure Fire

At approximately 4:39 AM on Thursday, the Middletown Township Fire Department (MTFD) was dispatched to the 200 block of Everett Road in the Lincroft section of Middletown for a reported structure fire.

The resident reported being awakened by smoke alarms sounding and was able to alert her family and safely evacuate the home. Middletown Township police officers arrived shortly thereafter, confirmed an active fire, and verified that all occupants were out of the residence. Firefighters from the Lincroft Fire Company and River Plaza Fire Company responded, along with Chief of Department Anthony Fulciniti, Deputy Chief Daniel Kelly, and Assistant Chiefs Kevin Morrissey, Jacob Lawrence, and James Abbes.

Upon arrival, crews encountered heavy fire showing from the residence and immediately initiated an aggressive interior attack using hose lines. Chief Fulciniti requested a box and second-alarm assignment, which brought additional resources from Middletown Fire Company No. 1, Navesink Hook and Ladder Company, Belford Engine Company, and Old Village Fire Company. Due to deteriorating interior conditions and the volume of fire, operations transitioned to a defensive strategy utilizing a tower ladder to apply large volumes of water and bring the fire under control.

The Middletown Township Fire Department's Air Unit, Fire Police, and Safety Unit responded to support operations. The Holmdel Fire Department provided additional manpower at the scene.

Emergency medical support was provided by Middletown Emergency Medical Services (MEMS), Colts Neck EMS, Port Monmouth First Aid Squad, Lincroft First Aid Squad, and Monmouth County's Medical Ambulance Bus (MAB-6). No injuries were reported.

The cause of the fire remains under investigation by the Middletown Township Fire Prevention Office under the direction of Edward "Buddy" Skelly.




As of Monday, September 1st, your bulk pickup day is now your bulk pickup week! The Township's contractor, IWS, now has a dedicated truck and crew for this effort

MTPD Promotes E-Bike Safety in PSA



NJAW Lead Service Line Replacement Program Door-to-Door Canvassing Continues

CDM Smith, on behalf of New Jersey American Water (NJAW), started a door-to-door canvassing effort related to the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) in Middletown on Monday, February 3rd. The team will be working in the Leonardo Elementary School District and Navesink Elementary School District in Area 2.


All CDM Smith inspectors will wear co-branded (NJAW and CDM Smith) high visibility logo vests and will have NJAW-issued Contractor ID badges. Inspectors will introduce themselves and the program to property owners and will then ask to enter the home to inspect the water service where it enters into the home (typically in a basement or crawl space).

The inspector will take exterior photos of the property and interior photographs of the service material and record the pipe material identified. Inspections generally take 15 minutes or less. At no time will residents be asked for money. Any customer that prefers to not have an internal inspection completed will be directed to alternatives to the inspections including self-reporting.

Keansburg Floodgate Walk begins at 12 PM**



The Middletown Environmental Commission invites residents to take part in the first-ever “Know Your Stream” Day on Saturday, October 25th from 1:00-4:00 PM, hosted by the Northern Monmouth Watershed Alliance. This will be a fun, educational afternoon exploring the Mahoras/Waackaack and Flat Creek watersheds that flow through our Bayshore communities.

Participants will receive a map of seven viewing sites and a stream observation sheet. At each location you'll be guided by a knowledgeable Stream Captain who will share insights about water quality, flood protection, and the natural features that connect our towns.

Here is a list of the stream locations: Neil Waackaack Preserve, Tatum Park (Lower Level), Keansburg Flat Creek, Hazlet Library, K-Mart Plaza, Holmdel Pool Club, and Union Beach - Grant Park (Firefighters Park).

Special Feature: The Keansburg Floodgate viewing area (Bay Walk West boardwalk entrance) includes a one-mile beach walk beginning at 12:00 PM, featuring a live NJDEP demonstration.

- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. Please follow all posted signs and stay alert while driving in the area,

as temporary changes to traffic patterns may occur. [Click HERE to read the County's press release for more information.](#)

- Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary's School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic through October, but pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project.
- As of Monday, January 13th, Broadway is closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to construction of the final phase of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project. Broadway will be closed for approximately two years. Detours were posted. Port Monmouth Road between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) reopened on Monday, January 13th, providing an alternate detour route for the Broadway closure.

THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM HAS LAPSED: WHAT TO KNOW



What You Need to Know	Information for Homebuyers
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The NFIP cannot issue new or renew existing flood insurance policies until the program is reauthorized. • Consumers who had a pending policy application or renewal should confirm with their agent that they have coverage. • Homeowners with active NFIP policies will still be covered until their expiration date, including a 30-day grace period. • NFIP will continue to adjust and pay claims as funds are available. If funds are depleted, claims payments will be delayed until additional funds become available. • If you have private flood insurance, you are NOT affected. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In some cases, homebuyers may be able to assume the seller's existing NFIP policy. • Lenders may continue making loans during a lapse, but must still conduct flood determinations, provide accurate borrower notices, and follow all other flood insurance regulations. They are also expected to manage safety, soundness, and legal risks, and consider private flood insurance options. • Private flood insurance remains an option and should be strongly considered.

Now is the time to review your emergency plans, stock up on essentials, and stay informed. Whether securing your home, checking your supplies, or signing up for emergency alerts, a little preparation goes a long way in keeping you and your loved ones safe.



Middletown Township is now utilizing the “See-Click-Fix” platform so residents can easily contact the Township to report any concerns. The Township is branding this reporting tool as *Connect & Correct* since you can submit your request via the website and track its progress through completion.

Visit [middletownnj.org](https://www.middletownnj.org) and click on the **Connect & Correct** button. This link will direct you to a page of categories you can choose from to report your concern.

Simply choose the relevant category from the list such as lost pet, pothole, sidewalks, playgrounds, etc. and add a brief description of the issue. You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.

Exciting news — the *Connect & Correct* app is now officially available on the [Apple App Store](#) and [Google Play!](#) The goal of the app is to make it even easier to report your concerns on-the-go as well as streamline communications regarding any concerns you may have.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

Middletown Township has an ordinance that requires owners of a business or vacant and abandoned property to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts and omissions.

The ordinance holds property owners responsible for maintaining and securing the property since vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties can cause a cycle of neighborhood deterioration. The ordinance penalizes owners whose property remains vacant year after year.
