Middletown Proclaims October 2025 as Substance Use & Misuse Prevention Month



At the meeting, Committeewoman Kim Kratz accepted a proclamation on behalf of the Middletown Alliance for Drug and Alcohol Prevention recognizing October 2025 as Substance Use & Misuse Prevention Month.

As the chairperson of the Alliance, Committeewoman Kratz spoke about how the volunteer-run organization educates the community about how to prevent substance misuse, underage drinking, vaping, and other risky behaviors. She specifically spoke about the resolution that the Township Committee passed that evening supporting both the Senate and Assembly's bills criminalizing the manufacture, sale, and possession of substances containing Kratom.

According to the Food and Drug Administration, Kratom has no legitimate medical use and can lead to psychotic symptoms that include hallucinations, delusion, and confusion. Kratom can be found in some ready-to-drink beverages like seltzers and teas. They are often branded as "healthy" herbal tonics or dietary supplements and are typically placed near the checkout counters, alongside items like energy shots, that are easily available at gas stations and in convenience stores. For the past decade, she has been helping manage Middletown Alliance Leaders, formerly known as Project P.L.U.S. (Peer Leaders Understanding Students), which is an after-school drug & alcohol prevention and leadership program for 5th and 8th grade students in Middletown. At the meeting, Committeewoman Kratz shared information about the following upcoming events:

- Red Ribbon Week (Thursday, October 23rd through Friday, October 31st): Red Ribbon Week is America's largest and longest running drug and alcohol prevention and awareness campaign. The Middletown Alliance funded campaign materials and student giveaways for the 3 middle schools and 2 high schools in town.

The Middletown Environmental Commission invites residents to take part in the first-ever “Know Your Stream” Day on Saturday, October 25th from 1:00-4:00 PM, hosted by the Northern Monmouth Watershed Alliance. This will be a fun, educational afternoon exploring the Mahoras/Waackaack and Flat Creek watersheds that flow through our Bayshore communities.

Participants will receive a map of seven viewing sites and a stream observation sheet. At each location you'll be guided by a knowledgeable Stream Captain who will share insights about water quality, flood protection, and the natural features that connect our towns.

Here is a list of the stream locations: Neil Waackaack Preserve, Tatum Park (Lower Level), Keansburg Flat Creek, Hazlet Library, K-Mart Plaza, Holmdel Pool Club, and Union Beach - Grant Park (Firefighters Park).

Special Feature: The Keansburg Floodgate viewing area (Bay Walk West boardwalk entrance) includes a one-mile beach walk beginning at 12:00 PM, featuring a live NJDEP demonstration.







Do not place material at the curb earlier than 7 days before start date. Brush, tree stumps, lumber, plywood, fence posts, railroad ties, or garbage will not be collected. Residents can bring leaves to the Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kanes Lane) from November 1st until June 1st. Brush is accepted year-round for residents.

- On Friday, October 24th, please avoid Palmer Avenue (southbound) on the Hazlet/Holmdel side between NJ-36 and NJ-35 from 6:00 PM to 6:00 AM due to a road closure.
- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. Please follow all posted signs and stay alert while driving in the area, as temporary changes to traffic patterns may occur. *Click [HERE](#) to read the County's press release for more information.*
- Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary's School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic through October, but pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project.
- As of Monday, January 13th, Broadway is closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to construction of the final phase of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project. Broadway will be closed for approximately two years. Detours were posted. Port Monmouth Road between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) reopened on Monday, January 13th, providing an alternate detour route for the Broadway closure.

Consumers who had a pending policy application or renewal should confirm with their agent that they have coverage. Homeowners with active NFIP policies will still be covered until their expiration date, including a 30-day grace period. NFIP will continue to adjust and pay claims as funds are available. If funds are depleted, claims payments will be delayed until additional funds become available. If you have private flood insurance, you are NOT affected. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In some cases, homebuyers may be able to assume the seller's existing NFIP policy. Lenders may continue making loans during a lapse, but must still conduct flood determinations, provide accurate borrower notices, and follow all other flood insurance regulations. They are also expected to manage safety, soundness, and legal risks, and consider private flood insurance options. Private flood insurance remains an option and should be strongly considered.

You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

Middletown Township has an ordinance that requires owners of a business or vacant and abandoned property to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts and omissions.

The ordinance holds property owners responsible for maintaining and securing the property since vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties can cause a cycle of neighborhood deterioration. The ordinance penalizes owners whose property remains vacant year after year.
