On Saturday, Middletown Parks & Recreation held the 7th annual Mayor's Challenge at Poricy Park! Local Business Owners: Invest Directly in Community Improvements to Benefit North Middletown-Port Monmouth Neighborhood Through Tax Credit Program



On Thursday, Middletown hosted a breakfast at Town Hall to spotlight the Neighborhood Revitalization Tax Credit (NRTC) Program, a no-cost way for businesses to invest directly in community improvements while earning a 100% state tax credit. The Township partnered with the Affordable Housing Alliance (AHA) to apply for the grant program that is administered through the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs. This program will specifically benefit the North Middletown-Port Monmouth neighborhood.

Mayor Tony Perry welcomed local business owners, community partners, and Township officials – thanking those who helped make the initiative possible. He highlighted how this program is a great way for businesses to invest directly into our community and have your company's name stamped on a meaningful project that highlights your philanthropic efforts.

Randi Moore of the AHA shared the organization's vision to "elevate homes, youth, and community" through projects such as helping homeowners afford home elevation and repairs as well as expanding youth programming through the YMCA's Bayshore Family Success Center in Leonardo and the Ideal Beach Community Association. The initiative will also create internships and job-training opportunities for local youth. Township Administrator Tony Mercantante also shared information about the need to replace the Tony Keller Community Center and the importance of having a facility in the area that caters to our youth and families.

Local business owners in the real estate, banking, and food industries, and members of the Eastern Monmouth Area Chamber of Commerce, attended to learn how to participate. Jason Rowe of Strategic Communities, LLC explained how the program allows companies to choose which projects they want to support while using it as an alternative way to pay state taxes. Any New Jersey business with a state tax obligation of at least \$25,000 in the current year is eligible to participate through the Corporation Business Tax, Insurance Premium Tax, or State Gross Income Tax (for LLCs, S-Corps, and partnerships).



NJAW Lead Service Line Replacement Program Door-to-Door Canvassing Continues

CDM Smith, on behalf of New Jersey American Water (NJAW), started a door-to-door canvassing effort related to the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) in Middletown on Monday, February 3rd. The team will be working in the Leonardo Elementary School District and Navesink Elementary School District in Area 2 this upcoming week.

All CDM Smith inspectors will wear co-branded (NJAW and CDM Smith) high visibility logo vests and will have NJAW-issued Contractor ID badges. Inspectors will introduce themselves and the program to property owners and will then ask to enter the home to inspect the water service where it enters into the home (typically in a basement or crawl space).

The inspector will take exterior photos of the property and interior photographs of the service material and record the pipe material identified. Inspections generally take 15 minutes or less. At no time will residents be asked for money. Any customer that prefers to not have an internal inspection completed will be directed to alternatives to the inspections including self-reporting.





Free Paper Shredding Event at Middletown High School North on Saturday, 11/15 from 9 AM - 1 PM



Middletown Township is partnering with the Monmouth County Board of County Commissioners to host a free paper shredding event. Residents may shred up to 100 pounds, which is equivalent to four office paper boxes or four large-sized trash bags. All papers will be shredded on location in the mobile trucks and the event will end either once the mobile trucks are full or at its scheduled end time. Large binder clips must be removed from documents; staples and paper clips can remain.



- On Sunday, November 2nd from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM, Leonardville Road will be closed between Main Street and Cherry Tree Farm Road for the Veterans Village grand opening. Please follow the set detour. From 1:00-3:00 PM that same day, there will be road closures of Leonardville Road (Campbell's Junction) and Cherry Tree Farm Road near Mater Dei Park for the Veterans Day Parade. Please avoid the area.
- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. Please follow all posted signs and stay alert while driving in the area, as temporary changes to traffic patterns may occur. Click [HERE](#) to read the County's press release for more information.

- Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary's School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will most likely be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic for the remainder of 2025. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project, which is expected to be completed by the end of this year.
- As of Monday, January 13th, Broadway is closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to construction of the final phase of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project. Broadway will be closed for approximately two years. Detours were posted. Port Monmouth Road between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) reopened on Monday, January 13th, providing an alternate detour route for the Broadway closure.

If funds are depleted, claims payments will be delayed until additional funds become available. If you have private flood insurance, you are NOT affected. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In some cases, homebuyers may be able to assume the seller's existing NFIP policy. Lenders may continue making loans during a lapse, but must still conduct flood determinations, provide accurate borrower notices, and follow all other flood insurance regulations. They are also expected to manage safety, soundness, and legal risks, and consider private flood insurance options. Private flood insurance remains an option and should be strongly considered. |

You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

Middletown Township has an ordinance that requires owners of a business or vacant and abandoned property to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts and omissions.

The ordinance holds property owners responsible for maintaining and securing the property since vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties can cause a cycle of neighborhood deterioration. The ordinance penalizes owners whose property remains vacant year after year.
