Last weekend, Westminster Presbyterian Church (WPC) hosted its 16th annual Field of Flags ceremony. Field of Flags is WPC's two-part event that pays tribute to every soldier who perished while fighting in the Global War on Terror.

In October, Mayor Tony Perry and Deputy Mayor Rick Hibell were proud to participate in the first part and help plant the nearly 7,000 flags displayed on WPC's lawn.

On Saturday, November 8th, Deputy Mayor Hibell, Committeeman Ryan Clarke, and Committeewoman Kimberly Kratz were honored to attend the second part of the event, known as the dedication ceremony. Deputy Mayor Hibell spoke at the event and personally thanked our veterans and the WPC, as well as provided information about Veterans Village. Members of the Middletown Township Police Department and Middletown Township Fire Department also participated.

In addition to paying tribute to our fallen heroes, Field of Flags also highlights veteran causes and veteran-based nonprofits. This year, all money raised through donations and the Field of Flags sweaters benefited Alpha Wave Project. This nonprofit, created by resident and retired Marine Kyle Rodger, is dedicated to reducing isolation and suicide among veterans and first responders.

Last weekend, the Middletown Township Public Library (MTPL) held a special Veterans Day edition of its Community Leader Storytime! Vietnam veteran and Middletown Veterans Affairs Committee (VAC) member Bob Siemer talked to the kids and parents in attendance about his experience in the military.

Bob served in the U.S. Army from 1968 to 1971 during the Vietnam War and held the rank of First Lieutenant with the 1st Cavalry Combat Engineer from 1970 to 1971. He earned many service ribbons, such as the National Defense Medal, Vietnam Service Air Medal, Bronze Star, and the Soldier's Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster.

In addition to being part of the VAC, Bob was also the Township's 2023 Veteran of the Year, which recognizes individuals whose service, leadership, and ongoing commitment to their fellow veterans have made a meaningful and lasting impact.

Bob helps veterans file claims for Disability Compensation, educates the community, and also spearheads the Township's "Thank a Veteran" program, where he coordinates with local businesses to provide discounts to veterans to help honor them all year long.

Help Keep Our Storm Drains Clear This Season

As heavy rain and freezing temperatures approach, please take a quick look at any storm drains in the street near your property. Leaves are falling fast, and when they pile up on top of a storm drain, they can block water flow and contribute to street flooding and icy conditions.

How You Can Help

- 🍁 If you see a storm drain covered with leaves, please sweep or rake the debris away from the grate to keep water moving safely. Move leaves and other debris out of the roadway so they don't wash back onto the grate when it rains.
- 🍁 If the drain is completely blocked or unsafe to access, please report it by calling Public Works at 732-615-2090 or by visiting [middletownnj.org/connectcorrectcategories](https://www.middletownnj.org/connectcorrectcategories) and submitting a request under "Roads".

DPW crews are out clearing drains across town, but with over 6,000 catch basins in our neighborhood streets, every bit of community help goes a long way.

LEAF COLLECTION ONLY – NO BRUSH UNTIL SPRING!

DO NOT SET OUT LEAVES AFTER YOUR STREET HAS BEEN COLLECTED – Violators will be charged up to \$1,500 for an individual collection. Do not place material at the curb earlier than 7 days before start date. Brush, tree stumps, lumber, plywood, fence posts, railroad ties, or garbage will not be collected. Residents can bring leaves to the Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kaness Lane) from November 1st until June 1st. Brush is accepted year-round for residents.

MTPD Promotes E-Bike Safety in PSA

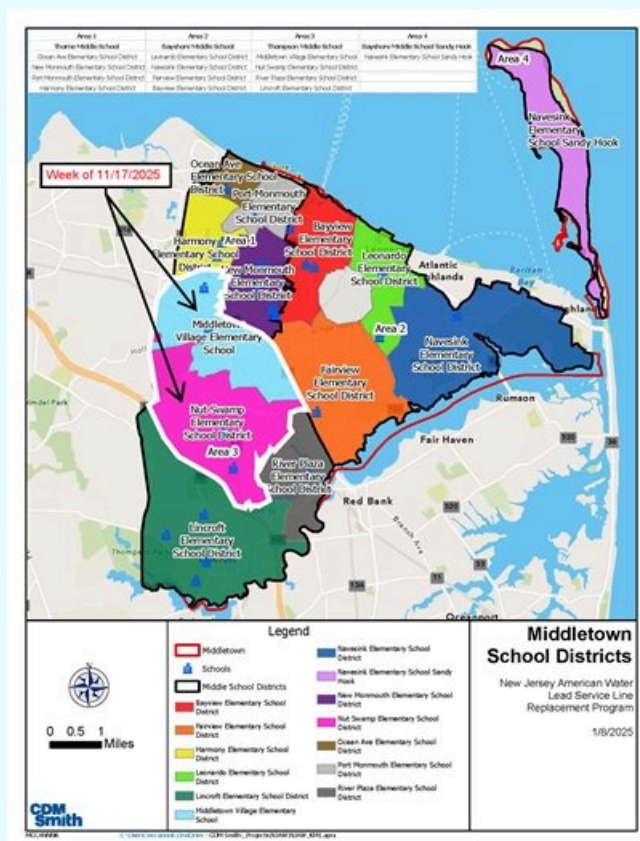


Across the country, and right here in Middletown, we're seeing a surge in injuries involving electric bikes and scooters, especially among young riders.

NJAW Lead Service Line Replacement Program Door-to-Door Canvassing Continues

CDM Smith, on behalf of New Jersey American Water (NJAW), started a door-to-door canvassing effort related to the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) in Middletown on Monday, February 3rd. The team will be working in the Middletown Village Elementary School District and Nut Swamp Elementary School District in Area 3 this upcoming week.

All CDM Smith inspectors will wear co-branded (NJAW and CDM Smith) high visibility logo vests and will have NJAW-issued Contractor ID badges. Inspectors will introduce themselves and the program to property owners and will then ask to enter the home to inspect the water service where it enters into the home (typically in a basement or crawl space).

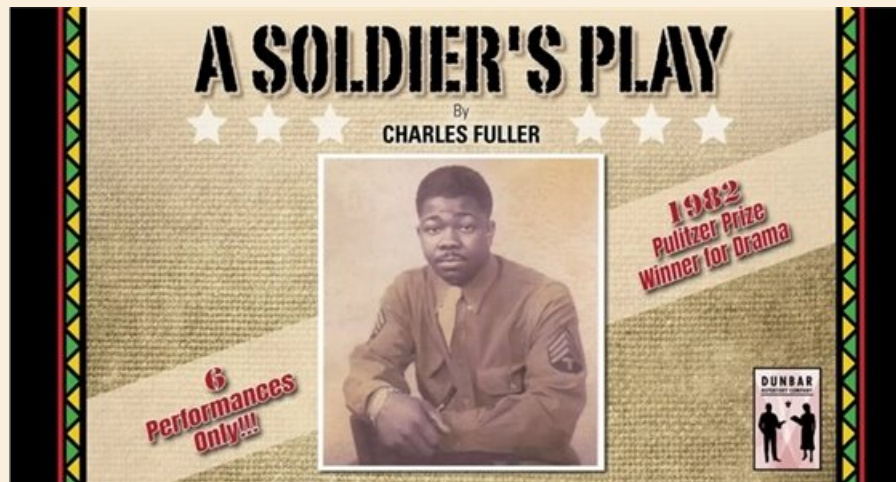
The inspector will take exterior photos of the property and interior photographs of the service material and record the pipe material identified. Inspections generally take 15 minutes or less. At no time will residents be asked for money. Any customer that prefers to not have an internal inspection completed will be directed to alternatives to the inspections including self-reporting.

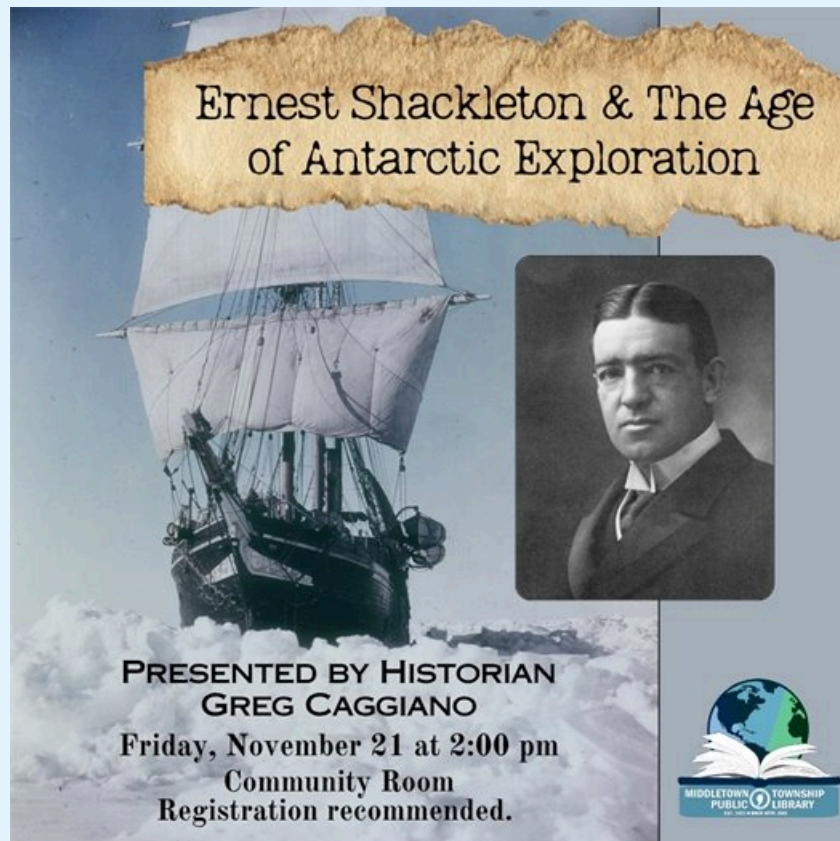

TRAFFIC SAFETY & DETOURS

MIDDLETOWN  TOWNSHIP

- On Saturday, 11/15, Nutswamp Road will be closed between Navesink River Road and Michael Drive from 8:20 AM to 10:00 AM. Hubbard Avenue will be closed between West Front Street and Navesink River Road. Shadow Lake will be using the entrance/exit off Alexander Drive.
- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. Please follow all posted signs and stay alert while driving in the area,

as temporary changes to traffic patterns may occur. [Click HERE](#) to read the County's press release for more information.

- Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary's School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will most likely be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic for the remainder of 2025. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project, which is expected to be completed by the end of this year.
- As of Monday, January 13th, Broadway is closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to construction of the final phase of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project. Broadway will be closed for approximately two years. Detours were posted. Port Monmouth Road between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) reopened on Monday, January 13th, providing an alternate detour route for the Broadway closure.

Connect with the Township to Help Correct Concerns



Middletown Township is now utilizing the “See-Click-Fix” platform so residents can easily contact the Township to report any concerns. The Township is branding this reporting tool as *Connect & Correct* since you can submit your request via the website and track its progress through completion.

Visit middletownnj.org and click on the *Connect & Correct* button. This link will direct you to a page of categories you can choose from to report your concern.

Simply choose the relevant category from the list such as lost pet, pothole, sidewalks, playgrounds, etc. and add a brief description of the issue. You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.

Exciting news — the *Connect & Correct* app is now officially available on the [Apple App Store](#) and [Google Play](#)! The goal of the app is to make it even easier to report your concerns on-the-go as well as streamline communications regarding any concerns you may have.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

Middletown Township has an ordinance that requires owners of a business or vacant and abandoned property to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts and omissions.

The ordinance holds property owners responsible for maintaining and securing the property since vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties can cause a cycle of neighborhood deterioration. The ordinance penalizes owners whose property remains vacant year after year.

HOW TO REGISTER OR REPORT VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY

Please visit middletownnj.org/abandonedproperty to either register your vacant/abandoned property or report a vacant/abandoned property.
