



Township Recognizes Former Police Chief Robert Letts as 2025 Distinguished Citizen of the Year



At the Township Committee Meeting on Monday, December 15th, Mayor Tony Perry and the Township Committee had the honor of presenting the 2025 Distinguished Citizen of the Year Award to Robert Letts. A lifelong Middletown resident who will be celebrating his 92nd birthday on Monday, December 22nd, Robert has been a true staple in our community over the years.

He enlisted in the United States Marine Corps immediately after his high school graduation and served in Korea during the Korean War. After returning home, he joined the Middletown Township Police Department (MTPD) as a patrolman. He rose through the ranks in his 37-year career with the MTPD and achieved the highest honor as Chief of Police until his retirement in 1991.

Chief Letts has achieved many notable accomplishments and received numerous accolades throughout his life, including being recognized as the 1980 Policeman of the Year for the State of New Jersey. He is also a Class of 1974 FBI National Academy graduate.

Earlier this year, he was featured in the [Middletown Township Historical Society's "Middletown Memories" video](#) to talk about his experience growing up in Chapel Hill and Leonardo during the Depression, as well as his incredible career.

A passionate advocate for first responders, he is the coordinator of the Middletown Emergency Volunteer Incentive Program and Township LOSAP Coordinator. He is also part of the Fire Department Planning Advisory Board and the 9/11 WTC Health Program and Victims Compensation Fund, representing over 40 firefighters impacted by 9/11 to help them get health and compensation benefits.

Township Installs Historic Marker to Pay Tribute to Middletown's Native American Heritage

Earlier this week, Mayor Tony Perry and Committeeman Ryan Clarke helped unveil the Township's latest historic marker. The new marker, located next to the Middletown Arts Center and Middletown Train Station, honors the site of the Chaquasitt Village Pow Wow Field in Ramezing.

The field was a Native American place for assembly, trading goods, and celebrating communication and spirituality between the Lenape Navesink people and the early settlers who arrived in 1664.

Sand Hill Indian Historical Association Director Claire Garland, local author Rick Geffken, and former president of the Eastern branch of the Inter-tribal Council of AT&T Employees, Marc Gottwerth, were instrumental in bringing this project to life.

Julie Diddell from the Westfield Historical Society and Frank Godlewski, a resident and volunteer for Middletown's historic preservation efforts, also came to the unveiling to show support.

This marker serves as an effort to pay tribute to our town's rich history as we celebrate our nation's 250th anniversary. We encourage everyone to check it out!

Holiday Safety Tips from Middletown Fire Prevention

Use only UL-approved holiday lights.
UL-approved lights are tested for safety and help reduce the risk of overheating, sparks, electrical shocks, and fires. Look for the UL label on the packaging or the tag on the cord before using them.

Water your live Christmas tree daily.
A dry tree can become a serious fire hazard. Keeping it well-watered helps prevent needles from drying out and reduces the risk of a fast-spreading fire.



DO NOT SET OUT LEAVES AFTER YOUR STREET HAS BEEN COLLECTED - Violators will be charged up to \$1,500 for an individual collection. Do not place material at the curb earlier than 7 days before start date. Brush, tree stumps, lumber, plywood, fence posts, railroad ties, or garbage will not be collected. Residents can bring leaves to the Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kanes Lane) from November 1st until June 1st. Brush is accepted year-round for residents.



This support is offered during sensitive hospital medical examinations and police procedures. Advocates also offer telephone support, information about the justice system, and referrals to services. The identities of the volunteers remain anonymous. Prior knowledge of sexual violence is not required. 180 is committed to fostering culturally and socially diverse teams to better serve the community, and bilingual capabilities are highly valued. Training will be provided free of charge to successful applicants.



NJAW Lead Service Line Replacement Program Door-to-Door Canvassing Continues

CDM Smith, on behalf of New Jersey American Water (NJAW), started a door-to-door canvassing effort related to the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) in Middletown on Monday, February 3rd. The team will be working in the River Plaza Elementary School District and Lincroft Elementary School District in Area 3 this upcoming week. There will be no work conducted on Thursday, December 25th and Friday, December 26th due to the holiday.

All CDM Smith inspectors will wear co-branded (NJAW and CDM Smith) high visibility logo vests and will have NJAW-issued Contractor ID badges. Inspectors will introduce themselves and the program to property owners and will then ask to enter the home to inspect the water service where it enters into the home (typically in a basement or crawl space).

The inspector will take exterior photos of the property and interior photographs of the service material and record the pipe material identified. Inspections generally take 15 minutes or less. At no time will residents be asked for money. Any customer that prefers to not have an internal inspection completed will be directed to alternatives to the inspections including self-reporting.





- On Saturday, December 20th between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM, expect delays on Nutswamp Road eastbound between Normandy Park and Shadow Lake Village for the 10U River Plaza-Lincroft Chargers National Championship Victory Parade.
- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will

remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. Please follow all posted signs and stay alert while driving in the area, as temporary changes to traffic patterns may occur. [Click HERE to read the County's press release for more information.](#)

- Church Street in Belford (near Saint Mary's School) between Leonardville Road and Drift Road is currently closed to replace Bridge MT-10. It will most likely be closed 24/7 to vehicular traffic for the remainder of 2025. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the course of the project, which is expected to be completed by the end of this year.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project Road Closures and Updates:

- Broadway remains closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to ongoing construction. Broadway will be closed until May 2026.
- Campbell Avenue will be closed at the intersection with Creek Road starting January 12, 2026 and is estimated to remain closed until October 2027.
- Detours will be posted. Vehicles traveling between Belford and Port Monmouth can use Highway 36 or Port Monmouth Road.

THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM HAS LAPSED: WHAT TO KNOW



What You Need to Know	Information for Homebuyers
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The NFIP cannot issue new or renew existing flood insurance policies until the program is reauthorized. Consumers who had a pending policy application or renewal should confirm with their agent that they have coverage. Homeowners with active NFIP policies will still be covered until their expiration date, including a 30-day grace period. NFIP will continue to adjust and pay claims as funds are available. If funds are depleted, claims payments will be delayed until additional funds become available. If you have private flood insurance, you are NOT affected. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In some cases, homebuyers may be able to assume the seller's existing NFIP policy. Lenders may continue making loans during a lapse, but must still conduct flood determinations, provide accurate borrower notices, and follow all other flood insurance regulations. They are also expected to manage safety, soundness, and legal risks, and consider private flood insurance options. Private flood insurance remains an option and should be strongly considered.

RENTAL UNIT OWNERS CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE REGISTRATION IN MIDDLETOWN

In accordance with Ordinance No. 2023-3369, all owners of a business or the owner of a rental unit(s) located within the Township are required to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts or omissions.

Annual Registration: Prior to January 1st of each calendar year, the owner of a rental unit(s) located within Middletown must register their Certificate of Insurance (COI) with the municipality. To complete the registration form, visit middletownnj.org/rentalregistration.

Minimum Coverage: The law mandates a minimum level of liability insurance as follows:

- \$500,000 for combined property damage and bodily injury for most rental properties
- \$300,000 for multi-family homes with four or fewer units if one is owner-occupied

Proof of Insurance: Landlords must submit a copy of their insurance certificate to the Township.

Administrative Fees: The annual registration fee is due and payable at the time of registration. The fees are based on the number of units owned.

Penalties for Non-Compliance: Failure to comply with the registration program can result in fines of \$500.

How to Comply with a COI Registration Program:

1. Obtain a COI.
2. Submit your annual registration form and the COI to Laura Russo-Kay in the Planning, Zoning & Community Development Department. Contact Laura at 732-615-2000 ext.2283 or lrussohay@middletownnj.org if you have any additional questions.
3. Pay any required administrative fees.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY



POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN



In accordance with Ordinance No. 2022-333, all business owners and owners of vacant or abandoned properties are required to register their property with the Township within 30 days of it becoming vacant.

1. Register your vacant and abandoned property within 30 days of vacancy by visiting middletownnj.org/abandonedpropertyform. Property owners or creditors should be required to renew the registration each year as long as the property remains vacant and/or abandoned and will pay a registration or renewal fee for each property registered.
2. Property owners or creditors must post a sign affixed to the building indicating name, address, and telephone number of the owner or the owner's authorized agent. The sign should be placed in a location that it is legible from the nearest public street or sidewalk, whichever is nearer, but should not be less than eight inches by ten inches.
3. Property must be kept in good condition to prevent hazards, blight, or other code violations.
4. Secure the building from unauthorized entry.
5. Continue to maintain the structure in a secure and closed condition and keep the grounds in a clean and well-maintained condition.
6. Provide proof of property and casualty liability insurance in an amount of no less than \$1,000,000.

Compliance is mandatory. Failure to register may result in fines or other enforcement actions.


