



Middletown Hosts 2026 Reorganization Meeting

Middletown Township held its annual reorganization meeting on Sunday, January 4th. Rick Hibell and Kevin M Settembrino, who were elected in November, were sworn in to the Township Committee to serve their three-year terms.

The Township Committee selected Tony Perry to serve his eighth consecutive year as mayor, making him the longest serving mayor in over 75 years. Rick Hibell was also chosen to serve as deputy mayor for his sixth consecutive year. This duo is the longest-serving mayor and deputy mayor leadership team in Middletown's history.

Monmouth County Clerk Christine Giordano Hanlon led the Pledge of Allegiance and Father Luigi Hargain of St. Augustine's Monastery performed the Invocation.

The 2026 Middletown Township Fire Department (MTFD) and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) chiefs, as well as the Middletown Fire Police, were also sworn in by Mayor Perry. The meeting ended with our dedicated volunteers from various boards, commissions, and committees reciting their Oaths of Office.




The Middletown Township Health Department and Middletown Alliance are partnering to offer a free "Quit Kit" to anyone who would like to quit smoking or

Complete Our Croydon Hall Multi-Use Turf Field Improvement Project Survey by Sunday, 1/18



In a Green Acres Grant application, Middletown is currently proposing to renovate an existing, heavily-used baseball field at Croydon Hall (900 Leonardville Road, Leonardo) into a modern, multi-use turf baseball/softball field.

A striped multi-sport area in the outfield for flag football or other sports will maximize year-round functionality of the park. The proposal also includes lighting system improvements and accessibility updates to allow for "Buddy Baseball" style programming.

The Township is seeking public input as part of its application. If you would like your voice to be heard, we encourage you to fill out our brief survey, which will be closing on Sunday, January 18th. Please keep in mind that this is a grant application and not a guaranteed project.


The annual licensing fee goes directly toward services that benefit your pet.





NJAW Lead Service Line Replacement Program Door-to-Door Canvassing Continues

CDM Smith, on behalf of New Jersey American Water (NJAW), started a door-to-door canvassing effort related to the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) in Middletown last year. The team will be working in the Lincroft Elementary School District in Area 3 this upcoming week.

All CDM Smith inspectors will wear co-branded (NJAW and CDM Smith) high visibility logo vests and will have NJAW-issued Contractor ID badges. Inspectors will introduce themselves and the program to property owners and will then ask to enter the home to inspect the water service where it enters into the home (typically in a basement or crawl space).

The inspector will take exterior photos of the property and interior photographs of the service material and record the pipe material identified. Inspections generally take 15 minutes or less. At no time will residents be asked for money. Any customer that prefers to not have an internal inspection completed will be directed to alternatives to the inspections including self-reporting.





TRAFFIC SAFETY & DETOURS

MIDDLETOWN  TOWNSHIP

- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. Please follow all posted signs and stay alert while driving in the area, as temporary changes to traffic patterns may occur. *Click [HERE](#) to read the County's press release for more information.*

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project Road Closures and Updates:

- Broadway remains closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to ongoing construction. Broadway will be closed until May.

- Campbell Avenue will be closed at the intersection with Creek Road starting Monday, January 12th and is estimated to remain closed until October 2027.
- Detours will be posted. Vehicles traveling between Belford and Port Monmouth can use Highway 36 or Port Monmouth Road.

Seasonal Tip: Pile Snow Downhill When Shoveling

Rain and snowmelt cannot easily infiltrate frozen ground, which inevitably causes flooding.

When shoveling, please pile snow downhill from your home where rainwater naturally flows. Keep your gutters unobstructed and directed away from your foundation.

Keep Fire Hydrants Clear of Snow

Every second counts in an emergency

- Remove snow and ice from the hydrant
- Clear an area approximately 3 feet around the hydrant
- Clear a path from the hydrant to the street



RENTAL UNIT OWNERS CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE REGISTRATION IN MIDDLETOWN

In accordance with Ordinance No. 2023-3369, all owners of a business or the owner of a rental unit(s) located within the Township are required to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts or omissions.

Annual Registration: Prior to January 1st of each calendar year, the owner of a rental unit(s) located within Middletown must register their Certificate of Insurance (COI) with the municipality. To complete the registration form, visit middletownnj.org/rentalregistration.

Minimum Coverage: The law mandates a minimum level of liability insurance as follows:

- \$500,000 for combined property damage and bodily injury for most rental properties
- \$300,000 for multi-family homes with four or fewer units if one is owner-occupied

Proof of Insurance: Landlords must submit a copy of their insurance certificate to the Township.

Administrative Fees: The annual registration fee is due and payable at the time of registration. The fees are based on the number of units owned.

Penalties for Non-Compliance: Failure to comply with the registration program can result in fines of \$500.

How to Comply with a COI Registration Program:

1. Obtain a COI.
2. Submit your annual registration form and the COI to Laura Russo-Kay in the Planning, Zoning & Community Development Department. Contact Laura at 732-615-2000 ext.2283 or lrussokay@middletownnj.org if you have any additional questions.
3. Pay any required administrative fees.

VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

In accordance with Ordinance No. 2022-333, all business owners and owners of vacant or abandoned properties are required to register their property with the Township within 30 days of it becoming vacant.

1. Register your vacant and abandoned property within 30 days of vacancy by visiting middletownnj.org/abandonedpropertyform. Property owners or creditors should be required to renew the registration each year as long as the property remains vacant and/or abandoned and will pay a registration or renewal fee for each property registered.
2. Property owners or creditors must post a sign affixed to the building indicating name, address, and telephone number of the owner or the owner's authorized agent. The sign should be placed in a location that it is legible from the nearest public street or sidewalk, whichever is nearer, but should not be less than eight inches by ten inches.
3. Property must be kept in good condition to prevent hazards, blight, or other code violations.
4. Secure the building from unauthorized entry.
5. Continue to maintain the structure in a secure and closed condition and keep the grounds in a clean and well-maintained condition.
6. Provide proof of property and casualty liability insurance in an amount of no less than \$1,000,000.

Compliance is mandatory. Failure to register may result in fines or other enforcement actions.





Connect with the Township to Help Correct Concerns



Middletown Township is now utilizing the “See-Click-Fix” platform so residents can easily contact the Township to report any concerns. The Township is branding this reporting tool as *Connect & Correct* since you can submit your request via the website and track its progress through completion.

Visit middletownnj.org and click on the **Connect & Correct** button. This link will direct you to a page of categories you can choose from to report your concern.

Simply choose the relevant category from the list such as lost pet, pothole, sidewalks, playgrounds, etc. and add a brief description of the issue. You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.

Exciting news — the *Connect & Correct* app is now officially available on the [Apple App Store](#) and [Google Play!](#) The goal of the app is to make it even easier to report your concerns on-the-go as well as streamline communications regarding any concerns you may have.
