



## Middletown Township Prepares for Major Snowstorm: Updates & Safety Tips

### STAY IN THE KNOW ABOUT SNOW WITH NIXLE

Three ways to get emergency notifications, such as severe weather updates, from Middletown Township:

Less urgent messages will be delivered to your email address on file. If it isn't on file, text your email address to 888-777 or download the mobile app.

Monmouth County has a Winter Storm Warning until 1:00 PM on Monday, January 26<sup>th</sup>. The Township's emergency operations team met this afternoon to discuss the snowstorm's path and response tactics.

Snowfall is expected to start early Sunday morning and continue through Monday afternoon. According to National Weather Service Mount Holly, the amount of snow forecasted is 8-12".

## NORTH ZONE GARBAGE COLLECTION POSTPONED

Due to the anticipated snowstorm, there will be no garbage collection in the North Zone on Monday, 1/26. There will be a "double collection" on Thursday, 1/29. Residents can leave up to 3 extra bags next to their carts.

Due to the snowstorm, there will also be no bulk collection in the South Zone on Monday, January 26<sup>th</sup> or Tuesday, January 27<sup>th</sup>. We ask all South Zone residents who scheduled bulk pickup for Monday or Tuesday to place their items curbside on Wednesday, January 28<sup>th</sup> or later in the week to give DPW crews time to clear snow from the streets.



## Tips on How to Safely Shovel Snow

- ❄ Be conscious of the strain shoveling can have on your heart. Discuss safety measures with your doctor if you have a history of a heart condition.
- ❄ Dress appropriately for the weather.
- ❄ Take breaks and drink plenty of water.
- ❄ Shovel while snow is fresh and watch for ice.
- ❄ Take it slow and don't apply too much pressure on your back.
- ❄ Be cautious around machinery and keep a phone nearby in case of an emergency.



# Snow is on the Way!

**SEASONAL TIP:**  
Snowmelt cannot easily infiltrate frozen ground and can cause flooding.

When shoveling, pile snow downhill from your home where rainwater naturally flows. Keep gutters unobstructed and directed away from your foundation.

## Keep Fire Hydrants Clear of Snow

*Every second counts in an emergency*

- Remove snow and ice from the hydrant
- Clear an area approximately 3 feet around the hydrant
- Clear a path from the hydrant to the street



### GENERATOR SAFETY TIPS

Middletown Township would like to remind residents of the following rules when using a generator:

- 10 feet of clearance is required from any structure
- Use UL approved extension cords
- Ensure carbon monoxide alarms are functioning in all businesses/homes while using a generator

## Kings Highway Improvement Project

**You're Invited to Learn More at the Public Information Center (PIC)!**

Middletown Township, in partnership with T&M Associates, is preparing plans to improve Kings Highway from Route 35 near Town Hall to Conover Avenue. Residents, businesses, and property owners are invited to attend the information session to learn more about the project and share feedback. Stop in anytime during the session to view project displays, speak with Township staff and project engineers, and ask questions.

**PROJECT PURPOSE**  
The project will rehabilitate Kings Highway and portions of nearby roadway segments to improve pavement conditions, safety, and overall ride quality. Work is being advanced using federal grant funding and performance-based roadway evaluations.

**WHY IS THIS PROJECT NEEDED?**  
The existing pavement has deteriorated over time. If left unaddressed, conditions will continue to worsen and could lead to more costly repairs in the future. Improving the roadway now will:

- Extend the life of the road
- Improve driving conditions
- Reduce long-term maintenance costs
- Enhance safety for all users

**PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS**  
Current concepts being evaluated include:

- Milling and resurfacing the roadway
- New high-visibility striping and upgraded signage
- Drainage inlet and pipe improvements
- ADA-compliant curb ramps
- Widening of existing sidewalk from Conover Avenue to New Monmouth Road
- New lighting along the sidewalk corridor
- Potential guiderail installation

These pedestrian improvements will coordinate with other Township safety projects to create a more walkable and accessible corridor.

Late fees begin February 1<sup>st</sup>.







The Middletown chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will be hosting a three-part workshop series at the MTPL called "Researching Revolutionary War Patriots in Your Family Tree". Registration is required.

Part 1 will take place on Friday, January 30<sup>th</sup> and will focus on how to add yourself to Family Search and connecting your family into the public tree. For the class, you'll need to come prepared with the names you have on your family tree, date and place of birth, and date and place of death for each one of your parents and your four grandparents.

Part 2 of the series will take place on Friday, February 20<sup>th</sup>. Once you are connected into the public tree, you will use that tree in conjunction with the DAR's Genealogical Research System to identify any potential Revolutionary War ancestors. This workshop will only help you identify a potential branch of the tree to explore further. Once a candidate ancestor is identified, traditional genealogy techniques will be required to prove that line. Part 2 requires attendance and completion of Part 1 or equivalent.

Part 3, which will take place on Friday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, will be offered for those who want one-on-one help with a Middletown DAR genealogist.

Participants must create digital artwork that portrays one or all of the following themes: Patriotism for Our Country, Pride in Our Communities, and Participating in the Celebration.




Help protect your family and friends from mosquitoes by taking part in the 2026 tire pick-up program.





- In June, Monmouth County began the construction of the replacement of Bridge S-14 on County Route 50 (Swimming River Road). The road will remain open throughout construction and two 11-foot-wide travel ways in each direction will be maintained. Construction is anticipated to take two years. #### U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Port Monmouth Flood Control Project Road Closures and Updates:

- Broadway remains closed between Main Street (Port Monmouth) and Church Street (Belford) due to ongoing construction. Broadway will be closed until May.
- Campbell Avenue is closed at the intersection with Creek Road and is estimated to remain closed until October 2027.
- Detours have been posted. Vehicles traveling between Belford and Port Monmouth can use Highway 36 or Port Monmouth Road.

## RESOURCES

### RENTAL UNIT OWNERS CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE REGISTRATION IN MIDDLETOWN

In accordance with Ordinance No. 2023-3369, all owners of a business or the owner of a rental unit(s) located within the Township are required to maintain liability insurance for negligent acts or omissions.

**Annual Registration:** Prior to January 1<sup>st</sup> of each calendar year, the owner of a rental unit(s) located within Middletown must register their Certificate of Insurance (COI) with the municipality. To complete the registration form, visit [middletownnj.org/rentalregistration](http://middletownnj.org/rentalregistration).

**Minimum Coverage:** The law mandates a minimum level of liability insurance as follows:

- \$500,000 for combined property damage and bodily injury for most rental properties
- \$300,000 for multi-family homes with four or fewer units if one is owner-occupied

**Proof of Insurance:** Landlords must submit a copy of their insurance certificate to the Township.

**Administrative Fees:** The annual registration fee is due and payable at the time of registration. The fees are based on the number of units owned.

**Penalties for Non-Compliance:** Failure to comply with the registration program can result in fines of \$500.

#### How to Comply with a COI Registration Program:

1. Obtain a COI.
2. Submit your annual registration form and the COI to Laura Russo-Kay in the Planning, Zoning & Community Development Department. Contact Laura at 732-615-2000 ext.2283 or [lrussokay@middletownnj.org](mailto:lrussokay@middletownnj.org) if you have any additional questions.
3. Pay any required administrative fees.

## VACANT/ABANDONED PROPERTY POLICIES IN MIDDLETOWN

In accordance with Ordinance No. 2022-333, all business owners and owners of vacant or abandoned properties are required to register their property with the Township within 30 days of it becoming vacant.

1. Register your vacant and abandoned property within 30 days of vacancy by visiting [middletownnj.org/abandonedpropertyform](http://middletownnj.org/abandonedpropertyform). Property owners or creditors should be required to renew the registration each year as long as the property remains vacant and/or abandoned and will pay a registration or renewal fee for each property registered.
2. Property owners or creditors must post a sign affixed to the building indicating name, address, and telephone number of the owner or the owner's authorized agent. The sign should be placed in a location that it is legible from the nearest public street or sidewalk, whichever is nearer, but should not be less than eight inches by ten inches.
3. Property must be kept in good condition to prevent hazards, blight, or other code violations.
4. Secure the building from unauthorized entry.
5. Continue to maintain the structure in a secure and closed condition and keep the grounds in a clean and well-maintained condition.
6. Provide proof of property and casualty liability insurance in an amount of no less than \$1,000,000.

**Compliance is mandatory. Failure to register may result in fines or other enforcement actions.**



Visit [middletownnj.org](http://middletownnj.org) and click on the **Connect & Correct** button. This link will direct you to a page of categories you can choose from to report your concern.

Simply choose the relevant category from the list such as lost pet, pothole, sidewalks, playgrounds, etc. and add a brief description of the issue. You will be able to enter an address or pinpoint the location of the issue on the map. You will also have the option to attach a photo if you would like, and then you can click to submit the report.

You will then be able to track the status of the issue through updates on the platform or via email notifications.
