The American Legion Post 338 and Middletown Township welcome residents to come together for the Annual Memorial Day Parade to honor those who have served our country. Parade begins at Bayshore Middle School at 10:00 AM.



The Memorial Day Parade steps off at Bayshore Middle School at 10:00 AM on Monday, May 28th. The route is as follows: Leonardville Road to Appleton Avenue to Center Avenue to Brevent Avenue, turn right onto Highland Avenue, then left on Leonard Avenue and right onto Viola Avenue to the American Legion Post 338 on Route 36. Roadwork & Detours

Memorial Day Parade Road Closures on Monday, May 28th on Leonardville Road, Appleton Avenue and Route 36

On Monday, May 28, there will be periodic road closures on Leonardville Road, Appleton Road, Center Avenue, Brevent Avenue, Viola Avenue and Route 36 between 9:00AM-12:00PM due to the Memorial Day Parade. Please plan accordingly and drive with caution as there will be pedestrian traffic in the area.

Paving on Main Street in Belford next Tuesday and Wednesday, May 29th & 30th

The County will be paving Main Street in Belford from

Maple Avenue to Route 36 next Tuesday and Wednesday (May 29 & 30). Main Street will be closed between 6:00AM-4:00PM between Maple Avenue and Morris/East Morris Street. Please plan alternate routes.

Roadwork on Kings Highway & Church Street
