Senator Joe Kyrillos Jr. Honored at June 18th Township Committee Meeting

The Middletown Township Committee presented former New Jersey Senator Joseph M. Kyrillos Jr. with the **Key to the Township** and a proclamation recognizing his 30 years of dedicated public service at the Monday, June 18th Township Committee Meeting. They also declared June 18, 2018 '**Senator Joe Kyrillos Day**' in Middletown.

Kyrillos is a long-time Middletown resident. He began his legislative tenure in 1988 at the age of 27, making him the second youngest person elected since the 1947 Constitutional Convention. He served four years as a member of the New Jersey Assembly, followed by 26 years as a New Jersey Senator.

On Saturday, June 16th, Deputy Mayor Kevin Settembrino and Committeeman Tony Perry had the honor of attending the Monmouth County WWII Battery Lewis Dedication at Hartshorne Woods Park in Highlands along with Freeholder Director Tom Arnone, Freeholder Deputy Director Lillian Burry, and Freeholder Gerry Scharfenberger. Battery Lewis was constructed at the Navesink Military Reservation during World War II and is the only 16-inch gun battery in the State of New Jersey.





On Sunday, June 17th the Middletown Township Fire Department was dispatched to an overturned kayak near Ideal Beach in North Middletown. Upon arrival, the Brevent Park & Leonardo Fire Company Marine Unit 31-2 found two people in the water holding onto the kayak. They were rescued and taken aboard Marine Unit 31-2 and transported to the Port Monmouth Cove Marina.



Approximately 7 members responded to the call from the Brevent Park & Leonardo Fire Company. All units operated safely under the supervision of Fire Department Second Assistant Chief John Friedmann.




Township of Middletown Sewerage Authority Now Accepts Credit/Debit Card Payments

Residents can now make credit and debit card payments on www.tomsanj.com by clicking on the "Credit Card Payments and Account Statements Link" or in person at TOMSA's Administration Office, 100 Beverly Way, Belford. A fee of approximately 2.95% of the transaction amount applies.

TOMSA also has a direct debit program. This allows customers to have payments automatically deducted from their bank account. Signup instructions can be found on the Authority website under the "Direct Debit Program" link or call (732) 495-1010.

TOMSA continues to accept cash, checks, certified bank checks and money orders.

HEAD AND NECK CANCER

This type of cancer can occur in the nasal passages, mouth, throat, or voice box. There are thousands of new cases of head and neck cancer each year, many of which can be cured. The best chance for a cure is when the cancer is found early.

THE WARNING SIGNS

Frequent nose bleeds; ongoing nasal congestion; persistent sore or growth in mouth or throat; constant earaches; lasting change in voice; bloody phlegm lasting several days; lump in neck lasting more than two weeks; or problems swallowing.

SCREENING

- Ten-minute exam by Nurse Practitioners at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center to look for signs of head and neck cancer.
- Resources will be provided on smoking cessation and nutrition.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- Adults who smoke, drink, or spend a lot of time in the sun.
- Adults who notice any of the warning signs of head and neck cancer.

 **2018 Paper Shredding Event in Middletown** 

Saturday, June 30 at High School North (63 Tindall Road)

Monmouth County has scheduled paper shredding events in local communities so that residents have opportunities to get rid of old documents and confidential files safely. County residents may bring up to 100 lbs. to be shredded. The shredding event will stop once the shredding truck is full. Documents should be free of large binder clips; staples and paper clips may be left on documents.



Roadwork & Detours

Paving on Navesink River Road

The County will continue milling and paving Navesink River Road from 7:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. on Monday, June 25th. During these hours, there will be one lane open in the direction of the Oceanic Bridge towards Highway 35. Detours are in place for the other lane.

Paving on Chapel Hill Road

The County will continue milling and paving Chapel Hill Road overnight from 7:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. next Monday through Thursday, June 25th-28th. There will be intermittent lane closures during these hours. Detours are in place.

The roadwork that has been taking place at the intersection of Kings Highway and Church Street to signalize the roadway is complete. Please be aware that there will be a traffic light at that intersection in the coming weeks.
