Congratulations to Middletown's Police Youth Week Graduates!



Committeeman Tony Perry congratulated our newest Police Week graduates on Friday, July 13th, along with Police Chief Craig Weber, Detective Lieutenant Paul Bailey, and Community Relations Officer Rick Cruz.

The Middletown Township Police Department held its first Police Youth Week Camp of the summer this week. There were 63 children, between the ages of 8 to 11, who participated in the program which gave them their first exposure to law enforcement at the recruit phase.

The Police Youth Week program, run by Lieutenant Charles Terefenko and Sergeant Kevin Gardiner, is a combination of classroom style learning and physical training. Participants learned firsthand about a wide variety of law enforcement training and techniques including officer safety, crime scene investigations, traffic enforcement and the K-9 unit. The program also emphasized the importance of citizenship and community policing.

The week concluded with a graduation ceremony on Friday, July 13th at the Brookdale Student Life Center. Committeeman Tony Perry handed out certificates along with Police Chief Craig Weber, Detective Lieutenant Paul Bailey, and Community Relations Officer Rick Cruz.




Township of Middletown Sewerage Authority Now Accepts Credit/Debit Card Payments

HEAD AND NECK CANCER

This type of cancer can occur in the nasal
passages, mouth, throat, or voice box.
There are thousands of new cases of head
and neck cancer each year, many of which
can be cured. The best chance for a cure
is when the cancer is found early.

THE WARNING SIGNS

Frequent nose bleeds; ongoing nasal
congestion; persistent sore or growth in
mouth or throat; constant earaches; tasting
change in voice; bloody phlegm lasting
several days; lump in neck lasting more
than two weeks; or problems swallowing.

SCREENING

- Ten-minute exam by Nurse Practitioners
at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center
to look for signs of head and neck cancer.
- Resources will be provided on smoking
cessation and nutrition.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- Adults who smoke, drink, or spend a lot
of time in the sun.
- Adults who notice any of the warning
signs of head and neck cancer.

Highway 36 and Church Street will have intermittent closures and detours set up Tuesday, 7/17 through Friday, 7/20 while Kiely Construction is working.


