

Middletown Township recognized September as National Recovery Month and Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month at the Monday, August 19th Township Committee meeting.






Congratulations to William Davis of Troop 122 in Port Monmouth for achieving the rank of Eagle Scout!

Pay off your library fines while doing some good by participating in the MTPL's "Food for Fines" program through August 31st. Each non-perishable food item donated will eliminate \$1.00 of late fees from a cardholder's account, up to a maximum of \$10.00 (although patrons are welcome to donate as much food as they want). Fees associated with lost materials and collection agency fees cannot be waived through this program. No expired food will be accepted.

MTPL will bring donations to all of the local food banks on a weekly basis, including Middletown Helps Its Own, Calico Cat, Project Paul and Lunch

Break.

In addition, any Middletown student (17 years & under) who cannot check out books because of a lost library card or late fines can get a digital library card. Students can do their Summer Reading through Overdrive and Hoopla using these cards. Digital library cards are available until August 31st at the Reference Desk.

If you are a Middletown homeowner, you may be eligible for a home rehabilitation grant of up to \$25,000 from the Township's Home Rehabilitation Program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. The Home Rehab Program assists low- and moderate- income households to repair or replace older systems in the home such as plumbing, heating, roof, or electric. Handicap accessibility improvements are also eligible.

The Director of Community Development will be available at the next Ideal Beach Community Association meeting for questions on Tuesday, September 10th at 7pm at the Tonya Keller Community Center, 50 Bray Avenue in North Middletown. The facility is handicap accessible. Applications will be available for distribution.

MIDDLETOWN TRAFFIC ALERTS

Tindall Road Closed for Milling and Paving from 8/26 through 8/30

Tindall Road will be closed for milling and paving from Monday, August 26th through Friday, August 30th from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Please plan alternate route and follow detours. Middletown High School North can be accessed via Swartzel Drive.

Palmer Avenue Closed for Road and Drainage Improvements

Palmer Avenue (County Road 7) is closed at Middlewood Road for road and drainage improvements. No thru traffic. Detours will be in place. If you would like an update on the detour, please call the County at 732-431-7760.

Monmouth & Navesink Avenue Road Closure Update

Gray Supply has been working in the area of Monmouth Avenue and Navesink Avenue replacing gas lines. They are anticipating the work will be completed this month. While they are working roads will be intermittently closed in the area and detours will be in place.

Route 35 Construction Project

Construction work on Route 35 began Monday, May 6th northbound from Cooper's Bridge (Red Bank) to Cherry Tree Farm Road and southbound from Cherry Tree Farm Road to New Monmouth Road.

Road work will be done with temporary lane closures from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM and from 8:00 PM to 6:00 AM. All work is weather-dependent.

The project, which consists of repairs and replacement of concrete vertical curb, installation of public curb ramps, repairs to drainage structures and resurfacing of the roadway, is estimated to be completed by December 2019.

Please keep an eye out for possible changes to the schedule.
