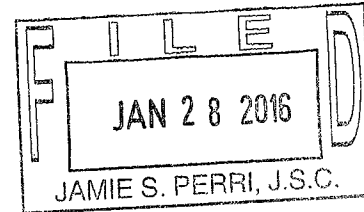

**ORDER FOR CONTINUED
TEMPORARY IMMUNITY**


THIS MATTER having come before the Court through the filing of an application by the Petitioner, Township of Middletown ("Middletown"), seeking entry of an Order continuing temporary immunity against constitutional compliance, exclusionary zoning or builder's remedy litigation pursuant to the Fair Housing Act, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-301 et seq. ("FHA") and the Supreme Court's ruling in the case entitled In re Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 and 5:97, 221 N.J. 1 (2015) entered on August 19, 2015 in accordance with the Court's Omnibus Order No. 4 dated December 2, 2015; and Middletown's Application for continued temporary immunity having been served on all interested parties as required by Omnibus Order No. 4; and the Court having reviewed Middletown's application for continued temporary immunity and any opposition papers filed thereto; and for good cause having been shown.

IT IS on this 28th day of January, 2016 here **ORDERED** as follows:

1. Middletown is hereby granted continued temporary immunity against constitutional compliance, exclusionary zoning or builder's remedy litigation. This temporary immunity shall take effect as of the date of the filing of Middletown's

Application and submission of its updated housing plan on December 14, 2015, and shall *as provided in the Court's Amended Omnibus Order # 9* remain in effect ~~for a period through and including forty-five (45) days after the decision~~ is issued by the Court following the trial scheduled for April 4, 2016, but no later than June 8, 2016.

2. Counsel for Middletown shall provide all parties on the Service List with a copy of this Order within seven (7) days of its receipt.
