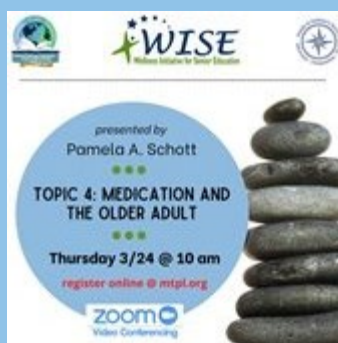

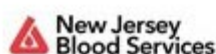

COVID-19 Testing Site at Brookdale Community College Closed TODAY, 3/18

On Tuesday, the Monmouth County Board of County Commissioners announced that due to the decline in demand, the COVID-19 testing site at Brookdale Community College was scheduled to close on Friday, March 18th.


The Monmouth County Board of County Commissioners partnered with Vault Health and Brookdale Community College in January 2022 to provide a state-funded COVID-19 testing site offering saliva and rapid tests three to five days a week.

"With the Brookdale Community College testing site closing, there are still options for those who need access to a COVID-19 test," said Commissioner Deputy Director Susan M. Kiley, liaison to the County's Health Department.
