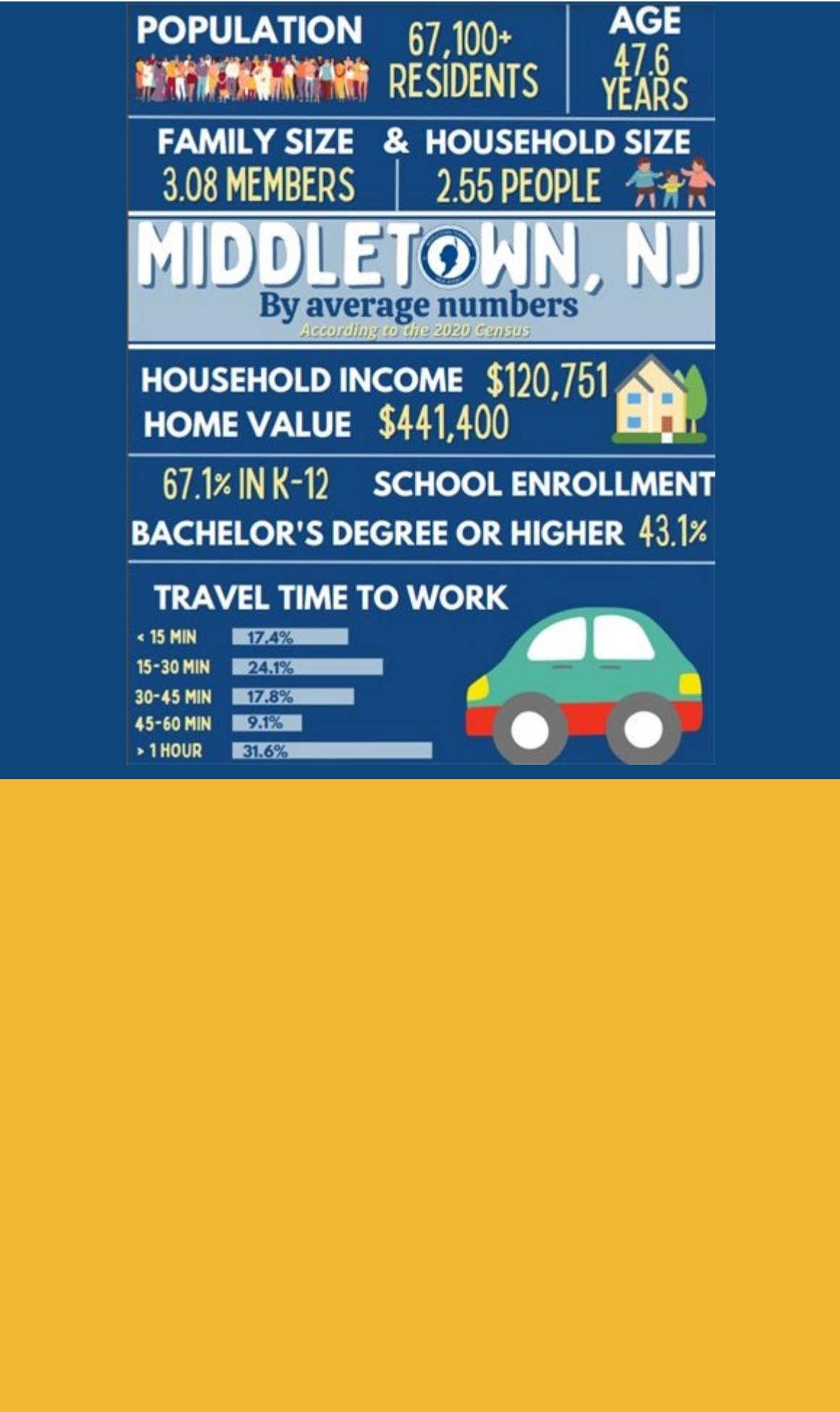

Laurel Avenue Closed As of Monday, 4/18



In response to the bridge strike that occurred last month on Laurel Avenue between Holland Road and Route 35, NJ Transit is performing repairs on the North Jersey Coast Line Bridge that goes over Laurel Avenue in both Holmdel and Middletown. These repairs will cause various lane closures along Laurel Avenue for approximately two months. **As of Monday, April 18th**, Laurel Ave. is completely closed. Detours (directing residents to Holland Rd. to Church St. to New Monmouth Rd. to Rt. 35) have been put in place, but we encourage residents to plan alternate

routes. Officers are also present to help regulate traffic.
