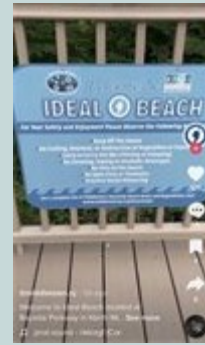

Spotted Lanternflies Have Returned: Tips for How to Prevent the Spread

Now that summer is almost here, spotted lanternflies are back! The spotted lanternfly is a serious invasive pest that feeds on sap from over 70 different plant species. Spotted lanternflies can negatively impact our agriculture, economy, and everyday life through the honeydew they excrete, which eventually turns into mold.



According to the New Jersey Department of Agriculture (NJDA), Monmouth County is in the "spotted lanternfly quarantine zone". Since spotted lanternflies are currently hatching and will not develop their wings until July, the Middletown Health Department advises residents to kill and report them to the NJDA when spotted. The Middletown Health Department also encourages residents to utilize the NJDA's checklist for spotted lanternfly quarantine areas, in an effort to stop the spread.

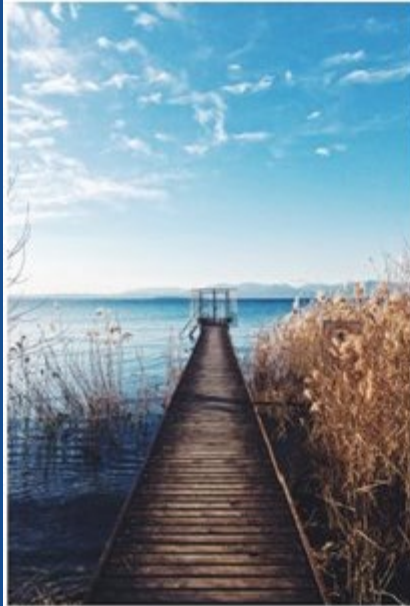

Prepare for Hurricane Season by Assessing Your Home's Flood Risk

KNOW YOUR PROPERTY'S FLOOD RISK

MAY 2022

The Atlantic hurricane season begins June 1st!



Throughout Middletown, there are areas that are more high-risk flood areas than others. To find out if you live in a flood-prone area, visit msc.fema.gov/portal/home and search the flood map using your address.

If you are a homeowner in Middletown and interested in purchasing or renewing your flood insurance policy, you may be eligible for a discount on your policy because Middletown participates in FEMA's Community Rating System (CRS). FEMA's CRS provides discounts for flood insurance premiums within and outside the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA), commonly known as the 100-year floodplain.

For more information about floodplain management as it relates to the building code, residents can contact the Middletown Building Dept. at 732-615-2104. For community-wide CRS initiatives, contact the Middletown CRS Coordinator, Stacy Krause PP/AICP, CFM at 732-615-2096. More information can be found at middletownnj.org/flood-insurance.

The Atlantic hurricane season began Wednesday, June 1st. Prepare for floods by searching flood maps to determine how high risk your home is and consider purchasing or renewing flood insurance if you are a homeowner in Middletown.

TRAFFIC SAFETY & DETOURS

MIDDLETOWN TOWNSHIP

- Due to a local charity's 5K, Nut Swamp Rd. will be reduced to one lane for about 1.5 hours beginning **Sunday, June 12th at 9 AM**. The road will be passable with

alternated traffic in the area of Nut Swamp School to Manny Way. There will be intermittent traffic delays on the streets off Michael Dr. and Manny Way. Police officers will be directing traffic at various locations. Please use caution when driving in the area.

- As part of the Middletown Walk project, removal and replacement of the existing sanitary sewer along Rt. 35 and partially along Kings Highway East is required.

Beginning Monday, May 23rd, Kings Highway East will be closed every day from 7:00 AM - 3:30 PM between Rt. 35 and Sleepy Hollow Rd. Construction is expected to last two weeks.

- Monmouth County officially reopened the Navesink River Rd. bridge. A traffic signal is temporarily in place to allow one lane of traffic over the bridge at a time. This temporary traffic signal will be in place for several weeks as work continues.
