



Middletown Remembers 21st Anniversary of 9/11 with Silent Memorial Service



On Sunday, September 11th, Middletown Township held a silent memorial service at the Middletown World Trade Center Memorial Gardens to honor the 37 residents we lost 21 years ago. Hundreds of people, including 9/11 victims' loved ones, Township Committee members, local dignitaries, first responders, veterans, and community members, stood in the pouring rain to attend the service.

"Despite the rain, our community came out in droves to support our annual memorial service, which is a testament to how we continue to uphold our vow to never forget," said Mayor Tony Perry. "The addition of our very own Survivor Tree at the memorial is also a reminder of resilience and hope as we continue to

move forward."

The Middletown Survivor Tree made its first public appearance at the ceremony. It is a descendant of the 9/11 Memorial Survivor Tree that endured the World Trade Center terror attacks in 2001. Our tree is the first clone produced from a cutting of the original that NYC Parks gave to a municipality outside of New York City. May it continue to be a living tribute to our strength as a community.

Mayor Tony Perry, Deputy Mayor Rick Hibell, and Committeewoman Kimberly Kratz were honored to attend and support our law enforcement at this important tribute.

Proceeds from the 5K will go to a scholarship fund created in memory of MTPD Detective Lieutenant Joseph Capriotti. As "keeper of the list" of the 37 residents we tragically lost on 9/11, Capriotti personally notified every Middletown family who lost a loved one that day. As a result of his response to Ground Zero, he developed cancer and lost his battle in June 2019. The memorial scholarship fund was created as a way to pay tribute to the tremendous impact he has made to the families of the victims and to our community.







Read Information about the State's Monkeypox Vaccination Regulations

Monkeypox (hMPXV) Vaccination in New Jersey



Who can get vaccinated?

The vaccine for human monkeypox (hMPXV) virus is called JYNNEOS. With the current limited supply of JYNNEOS vaccine in New Jersey, the following residents may be eligible for vaccination*:

- People who have known contact with someone who tested positive for orthopoxvirus or monkeypox virus (hMPXV) within past 14 days
(Contact your [local health department](#) to coordinate vaccination)
- People who attended an event or social gathering where known monkeypox (hMPXV) exposure occurred within past 14 days or who plan to attend an event or social gathering where monkeypox (hMPXV) exposure is more likely- such events would include those where close skin-to-skin contact or intimate contact will occur in an area where monkeypox (hMPXV) is circulating
(Make an appointment at a vaccine location) ➔
- People with multiple sex partners, or who have a partner that has multiple sexual partners
(Make an appointment at a vaccine location) ➔

Anyone who attests to their eligibility (by meeting any of the above criteria) is eligible for vaccination.

Current vaccination efforts focus on disproportionately affected groups, including gay and bisexual men, and other men who have sex with men. This may change over time.

*New Jersey is expecting additional doses from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and as the State gets additional supply the Department will continue to expand access to the vaccine.

HIGH PRIORITY GROUPS

Residents who are eligible for vaccination and who also have a condition that may increase their risk for severe disease should be considered high priority for vaccination, including people who:

- Have a weakened immune system
- Have a history of atopic dermatitis or eczema

With the recent increase in monkeypox cases, the Middletown Health Department would like to [share information from the New Jersey Department of Health](#). Individuals with questions regarding monkeypox symptoms or close contact should contact their healthcare provider. Only a healthcare provider can determine eligibility for monkeypox treatment.

Those who are eligible for the monkeypox vaccine can make an appointment at the Prevention Resource Network, which is part of the Visiting Nurse Association of Central Jersey, in Asbury Park. Visit [www.prvnaci.org](#) to make an appointment. Please note that vaccine supply is currently limited.



DISPOSING OF MEDICAL SHARPS/SYRINGES

To dispose of used syringes and needles safely in your household trash:

1. Place into FDA-approved sharps container or heavy-duty plastic container (i.e. laundry detergent bottle). The bottle should be sturdy, puncture-resistant and should not leak.
2. Close the screw-on lid tightly and label the sealed container *"Do Not Recycle, Contains Sharps"*.
3. Don't use plastic lids that can come off easily or glass bottles which may break. Do NOT put a plastic container with used needles/syringes out with the recyclables.
