The NORTH ZONE will have DOUBLE COLLECTION of GARBAGE on Thursday, 12/29 and Thursday, 1/5. Residents may leave up to 3 closed garbage bags next to the cart. Please do not block the cart with the bags.

The Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kanes Lane) will be closing at 1:30 PM on Christmas Eve (12/24). It will be closed on Christmas and New Year's Day (12/25 and 1/1) and will open on schedule the following days: Monday, 12/26 and Monday, 1/2. As a reminder, the Middletown Train Station Recycling Center Drop-Off is open 24/7.

Trees can also be recycled if brought to the Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kanes Lane) during business hours (Thursday - Monday from 8:30AM-4:30PM).



Coastal Storm Update and Resources



This morning, Mayor Tony Perry and Department of Public Works & Engineering (DPW) Director Ted Maloney visited Port Monmouth to survey the flooding from last night's storm. Ahead of the expected temperature drop, DPW crews will be working overnight until at least noon tomorrow to ensure that freezing temperatures don't impact the

safety of our roadways. They will be cleaning debris and storm drain grates, as well as salting and treating the roads for icy conditions overnight.

The last Township Committee Meeting of the year was an evening to celebrate! Mayor Tony Perry kicked off the meeting by announcing our inaugural Veteran of the Year: Veterans Affairs Committee (VAC) Chairman Dennis Beauregard. With the help of fellow VAC member Bob Siemer, Mayor Perry presented Dennis with a multi-dimensional engraved glass award to show our appreciation for his tireless efforts to advocate for veterans in our town and across the state. Bob spoke about his admiration for his fellow comrade and revealed that going forward the award will be deemed the Dennis J. Beauregard Veteran of the Year Award.

Dennis was drafted into the U.S. Army in May 1967. He went to Vietnam in August 1967 and was assigned to B Company, 3rd Battalion, 9th Infantry Division 6. He was wounded during “Tet” in 1968. In late January 1968, during the lunar new year (or “Tet”) holiday, North Vietnamese and communist Viet Cong forces launched a coordinated attack against a number of targets in South Vietnam. The U.S. and South Vietnamese militaries sustained heavy losses before finally repelling the communist assault. He has received the following military awards: Combat Infantryman, Badge (CIB), Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Commendation Medal, and Good Conduct Medal.

After Dennis received the Veteran of the Year Award, he and Bob presented the We Value Our Veterans Award to the Township Committee. Bob accepted that award from Governor Phil Murphy on behalf of Middletown Township. Middletown had to meet a certain number of requirements to earn this award, which recognizes the Township's efforts toward helping local veterans.

NO LITTER OR TRASH HAS BEEN COLLECTED - Violators will be charged up to \$1,250 for each violation. Litter or trash placed at the curb earlier than 7 days before start date. Brush, tree stumps, stumps, limbs, and ties, or garbage will not be collected. Residents can bring leaves to the Middletown Recycling Center (52 Kaness Lane) from November 1st until June 1st. Brush is accepted year-round for residents.

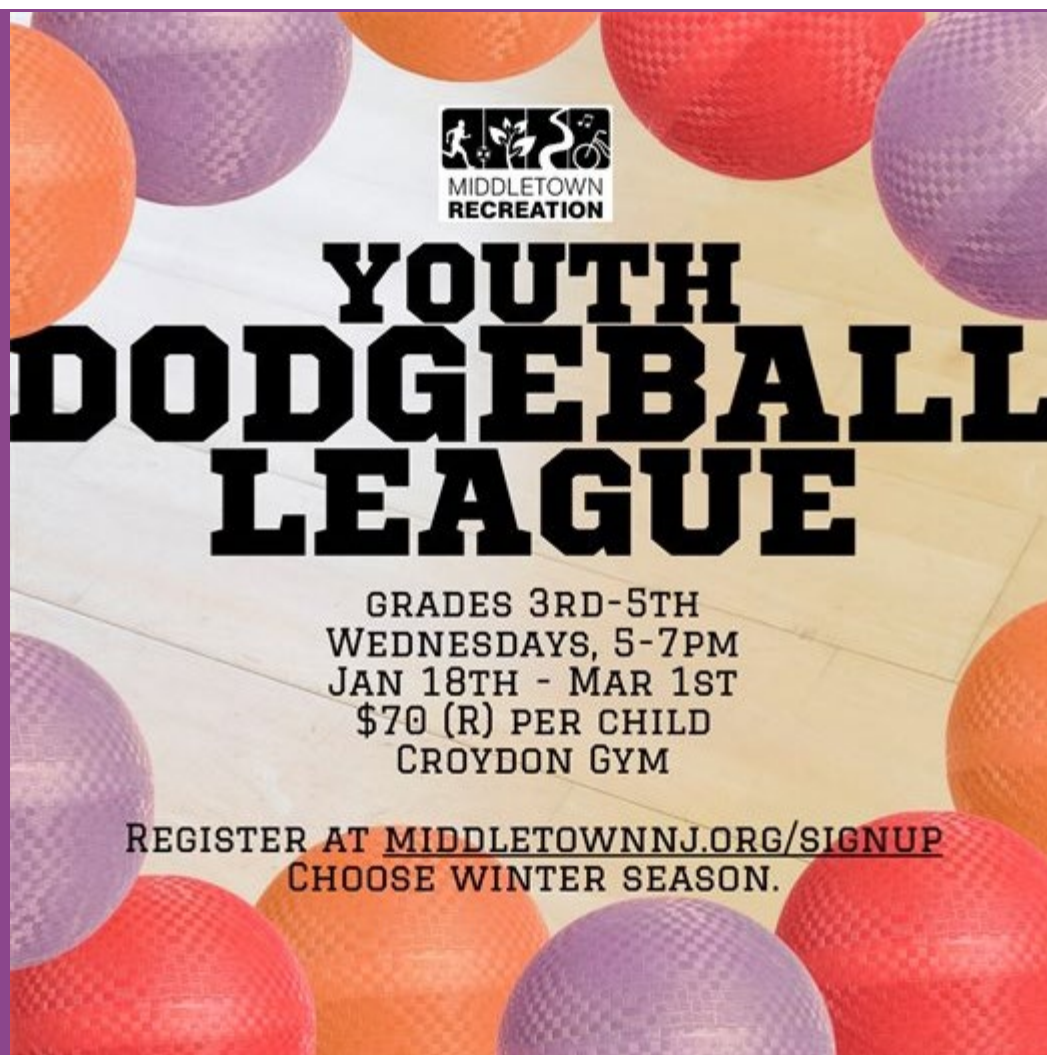


