The study will evaluate critical infrastructure, transportation, and evacuation routes that are at risk due to the effects of coastal storms in the study area including socially vulnerable areas (e.g., low income, limited English speaking, people of color, etc.).

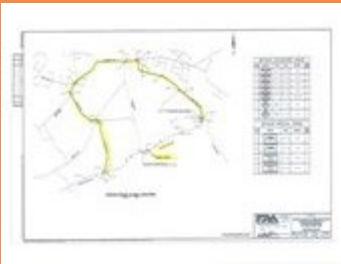


