




Join Middletown and American Legion Post 338 at Annual Memorial Day Parade this Monday, 5/29 at 10 AM

CHANGES FOR MEMORIAL DAY**

Due to the Memorial Day holiday, garbage collection in the North Zone on Monday, 5/29 will be starting earlier to accommodate residents and meet the landfill holiday hour schedule. Please put carts out the night before and leave approximately 3 feet of clearance on both sides of the cart.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers & New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Hold Public Outreach Sessions about Coastal Storm Resilience Study

On Tuesday, May 23rd, representatives from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection hosted two public outreach sessions at Town Hall about the Raritan Bay and Sandy Hook Bay Coastal Storm Risk Management Feasibility Study that is expected to be done in North Middletown, Keansburg, Aberdeen Township, Old Bridge, and the West Keansburg section of Hazlet. Outreach sessions were also held on Wednesday, May 24th in Aberdeen Township.

The study will evaluate critical infrastructure, transportation, and evacuation routes that are at risk due to the effects of coastal storms in the study area including socially vulnerable areas.

Community members were able to visit representatives at various stations around the courtroom to learn more and give their opinion about how to improve the resilience of our towns due to the impacts of coastal storms and flooding.

Middletown Animal Control Provides Tips about Fawns

HARRISBURG TOWNSHIP ANIMAL CONTROL
TIPS FOR CONTACT WITH ANIMALS

FAWNS



TIP #1
"If you care, leave it there"
A fawn will be left alone on lawns, in flower beds, and in tree lines for most of the day. The baby is best left undisturbed.

TIP #2
Mom is usually close by monitoring the situation. The fawn will move very little and sometimes not at all.

TIP #3
Mom will return in the late afternoon or early evening to feed and pick up her fawn.

TIP #4
If the fawn seems injured or in distress, please contact Animal Control to assess the situation.


**NJNG Offers In-Person Energy
